Survivor Benefits

Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)

DIC is a monetary benefit awarded to surviving spouses, unmarried children and under 18 and certain helpless children and parents of Service Personnel or Veterans who die because of "Service Connected" causes. In certain cases, entitlement can be established if the Veterans' Death is "Non Service Connected".

A basic DIC payment is made monthly to eligible persons with other allowances added under certain circumstances (ie. additional dependents or if a surviving spouse is so severely disabled as to be house bound or in need of regular aid and attendance).

How to Apply

VA Forms 21-534, Application for Dependency and Indemnity Compensation or Death (DIC) Pension by Widow or Child. VA Form 21-535, Application for Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) for Parents.

Supporting Evidence: Original or Certified Birth, Marriage, Death, Divorce Documents, Military Records/Medical Information concerning the Veterans Death, DD 214, Discharge Certification of the Veteran.

Other Survivors Benefits:

- Non-Service Connected Death Pension
- Restored Entitlement Programs for Survivors (REPS)
- GI Bill of Right (Death Benefits)
- Tutorial Assistance
- Burial in VA or National Cemeteries
- Home Loan Guaranty - Spouse

- Military Commissary and Exchange Privileges
- VA Life Insurance Settlements

Burial Benefits

* Burial or Internment in a VA Cemetery

* A US Burial Flag to drape the Veterans Casket

* Presidential Memorial Certificate to express the Nation's grateful recognition of the Veterans Service to Country.

* Headstone or Marker, may be provided for the graves of Veteran and Dependents interred in VA Cemeteries. Markers may be provided for Veterans interred in "other than" VA Cemeteries. Bronze Niche Markers are available to mark Columbia (Remains) sites in VA National Cemeteries and Memorial Monuments may be provided for eligible Veterans whose remains are not buried, recovered or identified.

Eligibility:

National Cemetery:

Burial in a VA National Cemetery is provided on a space available basis. Generally, deceased Veterans discharged under conditions other than dishonorable and service members who die while on active duty are eligible. Under certain circumstances, spouses and qualified dependent children of active duty Military personnel and eligible Veterans may also be buried in a VA National Cemetery. Grave sites in National Cemeteries CANNOT be reserved.

Head Stone/Markers:

The eligibility criteria for a VA Headstone/Marker is the same as for Burial in a VA National Cemetery. It is also available to individuals retired from the US Military, Selective Reserves and National Guard.

United States Flag:

An American Flag will be provided by the VA to drape the Veterans Casket of all discharged under conditions other than Dishonorable. Individuals retired from Active Military Service, Selected Reserves or the National Guard are also eligible for this benefit.

Burial Allowances:

VA May pay a burial allowance if any of the following conditions are met.

* The Veterans' Death is considered "Service Connected".

* The Veteran was entitled to receive "Non-Service Connected Pension" or "Service Connected Compensation" or would have been entitled to "Compensation" but elected to receive "US Military Retirement Pay".

* The Death occurs at a VA Facility, or Non VA Facility that VA had contracted with.

* "Lot or Interment allowance" may be paid for a "Non-Service Connected Death" in addition to the Burial Allowance.

Presidential Memorial Certificate:

Presidential Memorial Certificates are issued in the Name of the "Honorable Discharged Deceased Veteran" to the "Next of Kin" or relatives.

She served her people spiritually, emotionally and physically up to her death.
