

Disability Pension (Non-Service Connected Disabil-

Benefit Description:

Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) Pension is a program that provides financial support to "War Time" Veterans having limited income and are considered to be to tally disabled by the DVA to the level the disability precludes the Veteran from gainful employment.

The financial amount DVA will provide, depends on the Veterans current amount of annual or monthly income. The actual financial pension provided by DVA is based on a "Total Family or Household" income. Monthly payments are made to riage license dated 3 days prior to the Veteran to bring a total annual income, including current retirement/social security and other income to a pre-established monthly financial support level.

> Note: Total accountable income may be reduced by household un-reimbursed medical expenses, legal fees or related personal expenses.

Eligibility:

The Veteran must have spent 90 days or more of Active Duty Service of which at least I Day must have occurred during a period of War. The Veteran must have been discharged under conditions other than Dishonorable.

The Veteran must have "Disability" (ies) the DVA evaluates as permanent and total. For DVA Pension purposes, permanent and total means it is not likely the Veteran will be able to maintain a substantially gainful employment/position. UN employability and age are not factors in the DVA eligibility decision.

How to Apply:

DD214 (Discharge Certification)

VA Form 21-526. Veterans application for Compensation/Pension.

Medical Records or Summaries that provide a "Diagnosis and Prognosis of the Veterans current Medical Condition, documentation that supports the Medical History and Treatment of the Veterans condition, as well as treatment from Private Physicians or Hospitals.

Dependency Documents, Original or Certified copies of Birth and Marriage Certificates, Divorces/Death records terminating prior Marriages are required. This will impact on the amount of Pension the Veteran receives.

DIC is a monetary benefit awarded to surviving spouses, unmarried children and under 18 and certain helpless children and parents of Service Personnel or Veterans who die because of "Service Connected" causes. In certain cases, entitlement can be established if the Veterans' Death is "Non Service Connected".

A basic DIC payment is made monthly to eligible persons with other allowances added under certain circumstances (ie. additional dependents or if a surviving spouse is so severely disabled as to be house bound or in need of regular aid and attendance).

Eligibility:

National Cemetery:

Burial in a VA National Cemetery is provided on a space available basis. Generally, deceased Veterans discharged under conditions other than dishonorable and service members who die while on active duty are eligible. Under certain circumstance, spouses and qualified dependent children of active duty Military personnel and eligible Veterans may also be buried in a VA National Cemetery. Grave sites in National Cemeteries CANNOT Be re-

Head Stone/Markers:

The eligibility criteria for a VA Headstone/Marker is the same as for Burial in a VA National Cemetery. It is also available to individuals retired from the US Military, Selective Reserves and National Guard.

United States Flag:

An American Flag will be provided by the VA to drape the Veterans Casket of all discharged under conditions other than Dishonorable. Individuals retired from Active Military Service, Selected Reserves or the National Guard are also eligible for this benefit.

Burial Allowances:

VA May pay a burial allowance if Supporting Evidence: Original or Cerany of the following conditions are tified Birth, Marriage, Death, Divorce met.

> * The Veterans' Death is considered "Service Connected".

* The Veteran was entitled to receive 'Non-Service Connected Pension" or "Service Connected Compensation" or would have been entitled to "Compensation" but elected to receive "US Military Retirement

* The Death occurs at a VA Facility, or Non VA Facility that VA had contracted

":lot or Interment allowance" may be paid for a "Non-Service Connected Death" in addition to the Burial Allowance.

Presidential Memorial Certificates are issued in the Name of the "Honorable Discharged Deceased Veteran" to the "Next of Kin" or relatives.
