

Howlak Tichum Edith (Switzler) E. Danzuka

Edith (Switzler) Danzuka was born July 8, 1918 in Warm Springs, Oregon to Ruby (Smith) and Jasper Switzler. Edith helped raise her sister Evangeline and brother Delton when they were born. She then went on to boarding school at Warm Springs and Chemawa Indian School in Salem, Oregon where she graduated in 1938.

She began working in the summers in 1934. She worked in three administration buildings, the first one being where the Police station now stands, she served food to the Civilian Conservation Corp for one dollar a day and meals. She also seen four superintendents serve terms of office and worked under three secretary-treasurers, often acting as second in command in the absence of the General Manager.

In 1938, following graduation from Chemawa, Edith was a telephone operator for the Tribes, then a nurse's aide. From 1945 to 1948 she served as a tribal clerk and from 1948 to 1952 as land clerk. She began work in the Vital Statistics department from 1953 until her retirement in 1980. She began working for the Confederated Tribes when there was a total of three employees including herself. When she retired, the Tribes was one of the biggest employers in Central Oregon.

Edith will be fondly remembered as always smiling and a positive role model in the community. She was the first woman to serve on the Tribal Council. Her term was from May 1953 to April 1956, she served

in the capacity of the Vice-chairman. She then went on to serve on the council a second term from May 1956 to April 1959 but resigned before the term ended.

Mrs. Danzuka married Norman at The Dalles, Oregon on May 9, 1939. They made their home in Tenino Valley where they raised their daughter Eraina. While Edith worked in the office, Norman worked their ranch and was busy with tribal council, committees and being a father. Including raising her brother and sister, she also took in other children (during the summer months) giving them a home away from home. Edith raised her Great-Grandson Darreck Palmer from infancy and he was still living with her at the time of her passing.

Norman and Edith's marriage lasted 45 years until Norman had gotten sick and passed away November 29, 1984. She remained a widow but had a special friend and companion the last two years who she enjoyed being with and traveling to different places with. Sammy Danzuka will always hold a special place in the family's hearts for making her remainder years special.

Survivors include one daughter Eraina (Danzuka) Palmer, five grandchildren Lori Kerr of Portland, OR, Raynele (Willy) Danzuka, Ronald Palmer and Kelli (Clem) Picard of Warm Springs; and Jason Palmer of Gresham, OR; seven Great-Grandchildren Darreck Palmer (whom she was raising as her own), Tashayla & Henry Andrews of Warm Springs; Tory Lilly & Alexandria

Cortez of Portland, OR, Kaleb and Emily Palmer of Hood River, OR and one Great-Great-Granddaughter Cierra Palmer of Warm Springs, OR. Sisters Leota (Wayne) Saunders, Beulah (Raymond) Tsumpti of Warm Springs, and Susan (Lupe) Coronado of Walla Walla, WA; numerous relatives, and friends.

Preceding her in death are her parents Ruby Smith Switzler Coone & Jasper Switzler, husband Norman Danzuka, sister Evangeline Switzler Kalama Trimble, brothers Delton, Wilbert and Emil Switzler and Dallas Winishut Sr.; son-in-law Henry Palmer and grandson-in-law David Andrews.

She loved to do arts and crafts. She collected Native American books, beadwork, made pillows, basket making, shawl making and other crafts. Her favorite color(s) were green (beige/brown).

Always a lady in everything she did. She could be found in the kitchen canning berries, roots or cooking for cattle rides. She was a very hard worker, honest and very special to everyone who knew her.

Dressing ceremonies were private at the Bel-Air Funeral home in Madras, OR for the immediate family at 2 p.m. Thursday, June 15, 2000.

Then was transported to the Shaker Church in Warm Springs for overnight services. Burial was at 9 a.m. Friday June 16, 2000 at the Agency Cemetery. Peggy Williams-Guein officiated.

Council seeks Gaming Commissioner

The Tribal Council of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation would like to announce the following vacancy.

Warm Springs Gaming Commissioner (1 position).

(1) Establishment of Gaming Commission. There is hereby established by the Tribe a Commission to be known as the Warm Springs Tribal Gaming Commission (hereafter "the Gaming Commission"). The gaming shall be composed of three (3) persons, who shall be designated as "Gaming Commissioners". Gaming Commissioners may be members or non-members of the Tribe, provided that not less than one Gaming Commissioner shall be a tribal member.

(2) Selection of Gaming Commission. The Tribal Council shall by motion appoint a five-member Gaming Commission Selection Committee (hereafter "the Selection Committee") composed of two members of the Tribal Council, the Secretary-Treasurer of the Tribal

Council and two members at large. Members of the Selection Committee shall establish procedure for notice of vacancies on the Gaming Commission, recruitment of qualified applicants, interview and selection process. The Selection Committee shall submit their nominee(s) for any vacancies on the Gaming Commission to the Tribal Council for confirmation and appointment by Tribal Council Resolution.

(3) Disqualification of Office. The following person may not serve as Gaming Commissioners:

- (a) members of the Tribal Council
- (b) Employees of any gaming enterprise on the Reservation.
- (c) The immediate family of any gaming contractor (including principal thereof or closely associated independent contractor). For the purposes of this section, immediate family members are defined as: husband, wife, son, daughter, mother, father, brother, sister, grandfather, grandmother, legal guardian, or other totally dependent

relative of the individual. (d) Persons who would not be eligible to receive a gaming license from the Tribes; or (e) Persons having any interest in or responsibility for, either directly or indirectly, any gaming related contract with the Tribes or any gaming enterprise on the Reservation.

(4) Terms of office. The Gaming Commissioners shall serve for three-year terms, the respective term for each Gaming Commissioner shall be designated in their appointment.
