The abusive person usually grew up in a very unhealthy, dysfunctional environment. This type of behavior pattern is extremely hard to break. I do not think many people or even counselors realize how hard these issues can be to deal with. Not many people who were abused as children deal with their issues and let them go. They are in complete denial about the whole situation. The way this type of person reacts to things can give a hint as to where the person is
