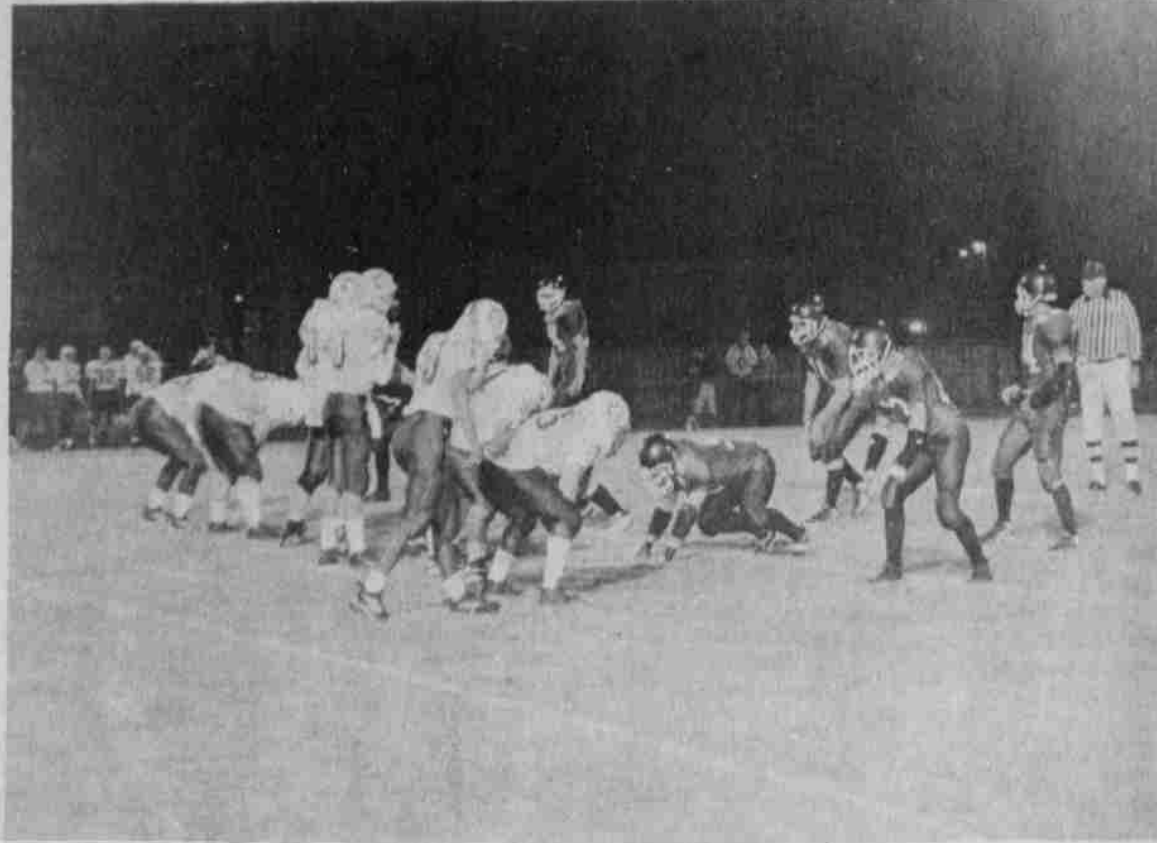

White buffaloes let close one slip away to Banks

The Madras White Buffalo football team was at home on September 29, 2000 to take on the visiting Braves from Banks, OR.

The buffs started the game with a ground attack, using John Adams to get their first score, as he ran the ball in from 11 yards out. Banks came right back, using it's passing game to get to pay dirt before the quarter was up tying the game at 7-7. Both teams couldn't get anything going until a fake punt by the buffs at the end of the first quarter, got them back into the flow of the game.

In the second quarter, quarterback Colter Barnes threw two passes to Jason Zarate one for 20 yards and the other for 22 yards. The second pass scored the buffs next touchdown

making the score 14-7. Then the braves connected on another pass play later in the second quarter once again tying the game at 14-14.

John Adams scored on a 54 yard run late in the third quarter, putting the buffs ahead 21-14, this score being John's second of the game.

In the fourth quarter Banks scored two touchdowns to take the lead and never look back. Madras had a chance to tie the game but fell short late in the fourth.

Colter Barnes threw the ball in the air 26 times, connecting on 12 of them for 144 yards one touchdown and one interception. Jason Zarate was 1-4 with 29 yards in the air, and caught the ball 5 times for 85 yards and a touchdown. Jake Wise had one

catch for 29 yards. Jeff Barnes also had one catch for 22 yards.

John Adams rushed the ball 11 times for 70 yards and two touchdowns.

Gordon Scott had a great game on the defensive side of the ball, getting in on a lot of the tackles being made.

Next up for the Buffs is a trip to LaSalle on October 6, 2000, where they will try and get their first win of the season. Game time is set for 7:00p.m.

What I'm saying is that this cowboy can get kicked, pawed, bit, freight trained, whatever you want to call it but the cowboy always got back up and tried it again to get his jockey on that horse. Deeper taught me a lot about Horse Racing as did a lot of other cowboys. What he told to do is "Never give up there is a way out of every situation." I truly believe in this so when you out there Wild Horse Racing just remember what my brothers words are "Never Give Up."
