Tribal subsistence fisheries in Zone 6(Bonneville Dam to Mcnary Dam) will be reopened for the retention of Chinook effective on Monday October 16, at 6 am until Monday January 1, 2000 at 6 am.

Tribal subsistence fisheries in Zone 6 remain open also for steelhead, coho, walleye, shad, and sturgeon between four feet and five feet in length


