## Korean War Commemorative Community Update

Last summer, Jon Mangis, Director of the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs, sent a letter to every middle and high school in the State of Oregon requesting that they become involved in the 50th Anniversary of the Korean War Commemorative Community program. Letters were also sent to colleges and universities. More letters went to all city and county governments in the state. Veterans' organizations were also asked to become Commemorative Communities. All told, more than 800 letters were sent.

There were several important reasons for participation in the commemoration program. One obvious reason to participate was to honor those who served in the Korean War, including their family members, especially those who lost loved ones in the war. Another reason was to provide recognition to those who contributed and sacrificed on the home front. Still another reason to participate was to help provide Americans with a clear understanding and appreciation of the lessons and history of the Korean War.
