All Warriors Society Memorial Veteran's Corner

The House unanimously endorsed one of the biggest increases for a Program that has helped millions of Veterans get college education since the end of World War II.

Under the legislation education benefits available to a veteran with three years service would increase over the next three years from the current \$650 a month to \$1,100.

For veterans with two years of services or reservists, the maximum benefits would go up from \$528 to \$894. This is a big boost for the veterans who wish to further their edu-

Selective Services adds page to Web.

The selective service has added a change of address page to its Website that will allow young men to update their registration information on line.

Any man who is registered and was born after 1959 can update his address information by connecting to the Selective Service Web site at

WWW.SSS.gov.

All young men, ages 18 through 25 must notify Selective Services within 10 days of an address change. Federal Law requires virtually all men to register with Selective Service within 30 days of turning 18.

All U.S. male citizens, no matter where they live, as well as male non-citizens, residing in the United States, are required to register.

Although the United States relies on all-volunteer military, remains intact to ensure the draft could be reinstated quickly.

If you fail to appear as so ordered, the Tribal Court may enter a complaint for Contempt of Court and issue a warrant for your arrest.

Tribal Governing conference coming in August

Fairfax, VA- Tribal leaders, council members, chairpersons, attorneys and more from across the U.S. and Canada will be attending Tribal Governing in the 21st Century, presented by Falmouth Institute. This August program, held in Reno, will provide an opportunity for participants to learn about the best practices in economic development, growth management, parliamentary procedures and building relationships within their communities.

Program highlights include: a Government-to-Government Relations presentation given by Kevin Gover, former assistant secretary of the Interior for Indian Affairs; a Best Practices panel discussion, where participants will have an opportunity to ask the experts what works and what doesn't work; a mock meeting, where attendees will learn the basics of parliamentary procedures; and roundtable work sessions,

where attendees will use basics of parliamentary conflicts to brainstorm solutions that can be implemented.

Participants can choose six of eight workshops to attend: Indian Land and the Law, Ethics, Performance Measurements in Budgeting, Zoning on Indian Land, Robert's Rules of Order, Jurisdiction, New Developments in Self-Determination, and Tribal Elections.

Tribal Governing in the 21st Century will be held August 19-22, 2001 at the Silver Legacy Hotel in Reno, Nevada. June is Safety Awareness Month

Tips on choosing safe fireworks
It is extremely important to know the difference between a legal consumer firework and a dangerous explosive device. Items such as M-80s, M-100s and blockbusters are not fireworks, they are federally banned explosives. They can cause serious injury or even death. Stay away from anything that isn't clearly labeled with the name of the item, the manufacturer's name and instructions for proper use. Here are some more tips to help ensure a safe Fourth of July:

- Fireworks are not toys.
- NEVER give fireworks to young children. Close, adult supervision of all fireworks activities is mandatory. Even sparklers can be unsafe if used improperly.
- Select and use only legal devices.
- Stay away from illegal explosives
- Homemade fireworks are deadly. Never attempt to make your own devices and do not purchase or use any kits that are advertised for making fireworks. Mixing and loading chemical powders is very dangerous and can kill or seriously injure you. Leave the making of fireworks to the experts.
