California Men's Hoopa and Tacoma Ladies Natives teams take 2001 Pi-Ume-Sha tourney

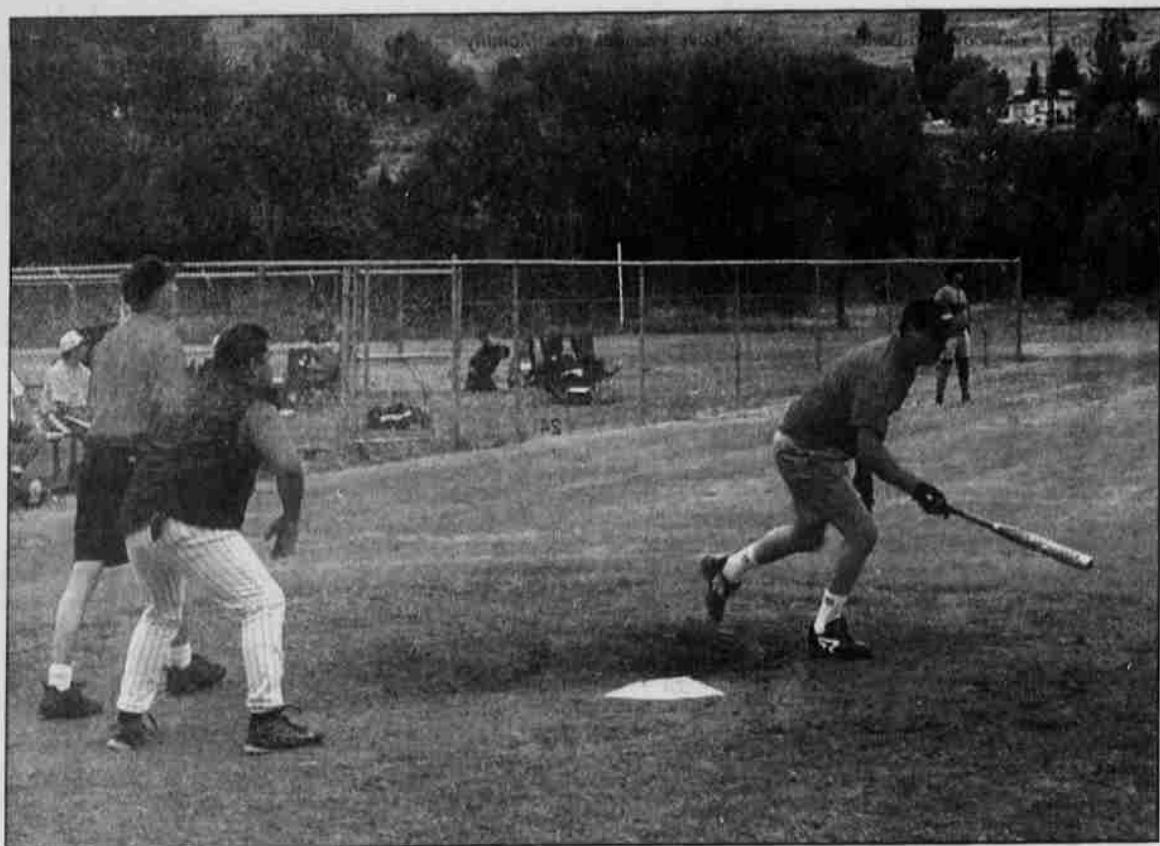

"Best Bout" went to James Ramos vs Juan Romero.

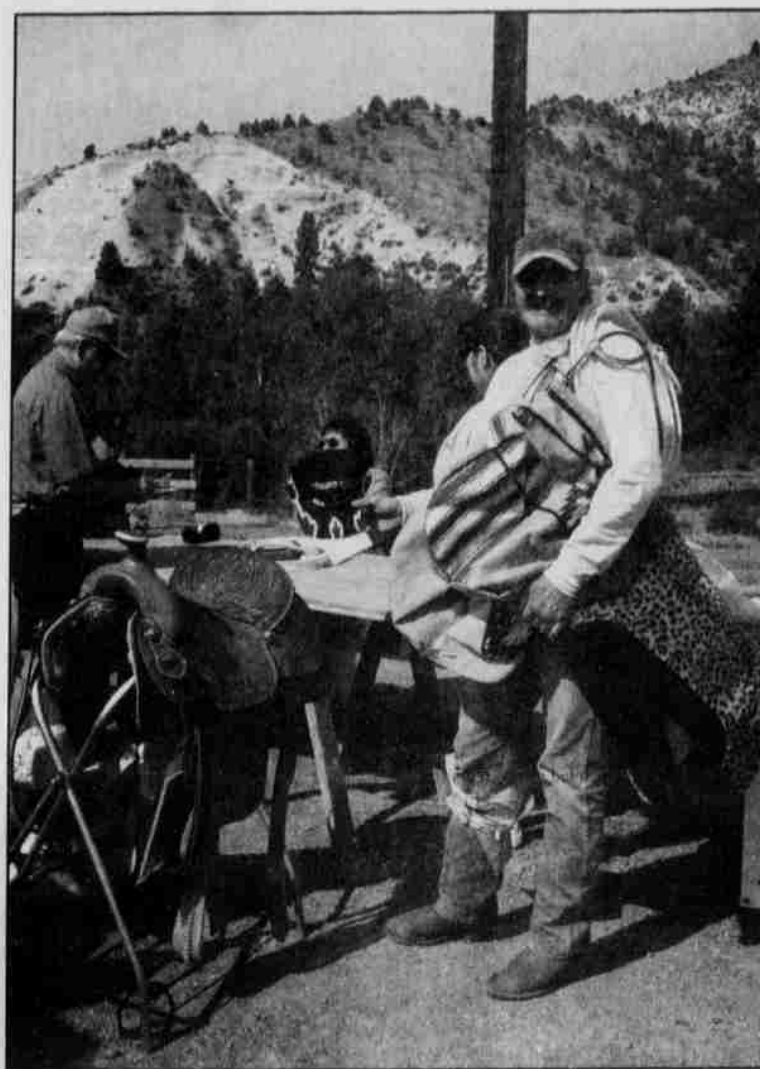
