# Volunteers needed

The Deschutes County Chapter of the American Red Cross is recruiting Warm Springs residents to become Disaster Services Volunteers. The Red Cross has placed a trailer equipped with enough supplies to open a 100 person shelter on the Warm Springs Reservation. The next step toward quick response to the disaster needs in the area is the training of a Disaster Action Team (DAT) on the Reservation. Members of the DAT will provide quick response for disasters from casework to providing relief assistance to victims of house fires and opening a shelter should the need arise.

Training includes the core disaster courses; Introduction to Disaster Services, Mass Care and Shelter

Operation. After completing the core courses, members will be given CPR and First Aid training. The final required class is Family Services Casework. All training is provided free to volunteers.

Having the Disaster Services Trailer in position at Warm Springs will provide a quick response to the need for shelter in the area. However, to accomplish this the Red Cross must have trained staff ready to respond quickly.

# Howlak Tichum Evelyn Uyeji

Evelyn Uyeji, age 61 years old, passed June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2001 at Southwest Washington Medical Center of Vancouver, WA. Death was due to Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome four weeks after an internal surgery procedure. Uyeji was born July 22, 1940. She was of Hopi descent from Hotvilla, Arizona. Her parents were Edmund and Jean Neqwatawa from the same location.

In 1967 Uyeji then moved to Simnasho, OR. In 1968 she married Hamilton Greeley of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation, there in Simnasho she learned the Wasco-Warm Springs culture, and was adopted as a family member by the Simnasho Elders for her dedication for learning the ancestral songs of the Washut Religion in Simnasho. She also worked as a community counselor in Warm Springs. Later on she divorced Mr. Greeley while remaining a family member and friend to the people of Warm Springs, OR.

In 1983, she married Les Uyeji, while residing in Vancouver, WA. There she enjoyed her life and home while working for the special education program of the Vancouver School District.

Her hobbies included Native American beadwork, personal creations of arts and crafts, attending Pow-Wows to dance, and sharing

laughs and smiles with families and friends.

Survivors include: her husband Les Uyeji; sons James Greeley, Mike Gomez; daughters Linda and Peggy Gomez; brothers Tyson, Robert, and Harold Neqwatawa; sisters Emma Hattton, Diane Barbee and Mary Nez, and 6 grandchildren.

Dressing Ceremony was held 11:00 am, Friday June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2001 at Evergreen Staples Funeral Chapel in Vancouver, WA. Pending was cremation after funeral services. Remains were then brought to Simnasho longhouse for 12:00 pm Saturday June 9<sup>th</sup>, 2001 funeral services, following with burial at Simnasho cemetery. In loving memory of Evelyn Bentley Neqwatawa-Uyeji. (Formerly Evelyn Greeley.) The family would like to thank the Drummers of the Washut Religion for attending both services; we are honored to have had your songs bring us enlightenment, also for the Officiating by Fred and Olivia Wallulatum. We want to also thank everyone for the traditional foods, the cooks of the longhouse, and the Warm Springs people to make these emotional times make a complete circle.

We are truly blessed, as Native American people to have such support from loved ones for our loved ones.

## Reunion scheduled for September

The WWII, U.S. Navy Armed Guard and Merchant Marines "Northwest Passage" group will have a reunion September 18-20 at the Phoenix Inn, Bend, Oregon.

Invitation is extended to any veterans who served with these two groups during WWII.

Reservations at the motel and the banquet must be made by Aug. 15.

The Armed Guard branch of the U.S. Navy was formed during WWII

and was made up of Navy personnel trained and assigned to man guns on merchant ships to defend them in case of attack. These men, numbering 144,970, served on 6,236 ships during WWII, of which 710 were sunk. The Merchant Marines served alongside these Armed Guard lads on the same ships so they are also included in the Armed Guard registry.

The goal of these groups, besides the fellowship they provide, is to locate as many personnel who served in the Armed Guard and Merchant Marines during WWII as is possible by holding these reunions in various areas. As of June 15, 2001, 18,480 were located by the national registry office, and time is running out.

There are no dues, contributions provide the necessary funds for postage, printing and supplies; and all record keeping and computer work done is by volunteers. Word of mouth and reunion news is our way of "getting the word out."

# Local foster homes needed

Children's Protective Services (CPS) is looking for a local; preferably Warm Springs married couple with no children, who have a home with at least 3 - 4 bedrooms. This particular home would be referred to as the "Professional Foster Home" where this couple will need to work collaboratively with CPS as well as provide foster care to high risk adolescents who do not have an adequate placement.

Any interested parties will need to meet the foster care standards and guidelines, foster care certification process, pass a Criminal Background check, be free from the use of alcohol and/or drug use; and agree to a Contract that is set up between The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs (Children's Protective Services) and yourself.
