Bauman said she is seeking tribal

The library has a few cases and shelves for three-dimensional artwork, and space for about 40 to 50 two-dimensional artworks that would hang on the walls of the second floor of the library.

Minimum size for framed art is 16 by 20 inches.

Artworks may or may not be for sale. Art for sale must have a purchase price. The library does not take a commission.

The phone number of the artist will be on the label, and anyone wishing to purchase art will contact the artist directly.

The show will run from Nov. 16 to Jan. 31. Artwork should be delivered on Nov. 9 or Nov. 10, between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

## Fire and Safety hoping to recruit volunteers

The Warm Springs Fire and Safety Department is recruiting new volunteers. The department now has only half a dozen volunteers, but would like to increase that number to between 12 and 15.

In its current campaign to recruit new volunteers, the Fire and Safety Department is providing some profile information on the people who work at the department. This effort is intended to help the Warm Springs community become more familiar with the Fire and Safety personnel, said Fire and Safety Chief Dan Martinez.

Brad is also a hazardous materials technician and has received specialized training in search and rescue, is a high-angle rescue instructor, and swift-water rescue technician.

The most rewarding part of his work is going home and feeling good at having done his job well.

The hardest part of being a fire/medic, he said, "to see people fall back into harmful patterns and not help themselves when there's so much more out there."

He was led into the fire/EMS field at the age of 15, when he had to administer CPR to his best friend. On a personal note, Rumbarger has been married to Cynthia for 14 years. They live in Crooked River Ranch with their two sons, Ethan, 11, and Elijah, 4.

Rumbarger enjoys working as a

general contractor, volunteering with the Boy Scouts in Redmond, and being Search and Rescue coordinator for Jefferson County. He is also a part-time fire/medic at Crooked River Rural Fire Protection District.

prevention officer at Warm Springs Fire and Safety, where she has been employed since 1987. She is an EMT-Paramedic and Firefighter II.

Karla is also a hazardous materials technician, and has received specialized training in search and rescue, law enforcement, and has also taken some fire administration classes at WOSU.

The best part of her work, she said, "is having the ability and knowledge to save lives."

And the worst part, "seeing a lot of things that you can't do anything about."

She first became interested in EMT-paramedic work she had a child who suffered from a seizure disorder as an infant, which required Bagley-Tias to call for an ambulance. This experience led to her taking a First Aid class, and then to volunteering at Fire and Safety, which evolved into a career in the Fire/EMS field.

Karla is a tribal member, who has been married to Oswald "Bear" Tias for nine years. She has two children, Tiana, 17, and Justin, 15.
