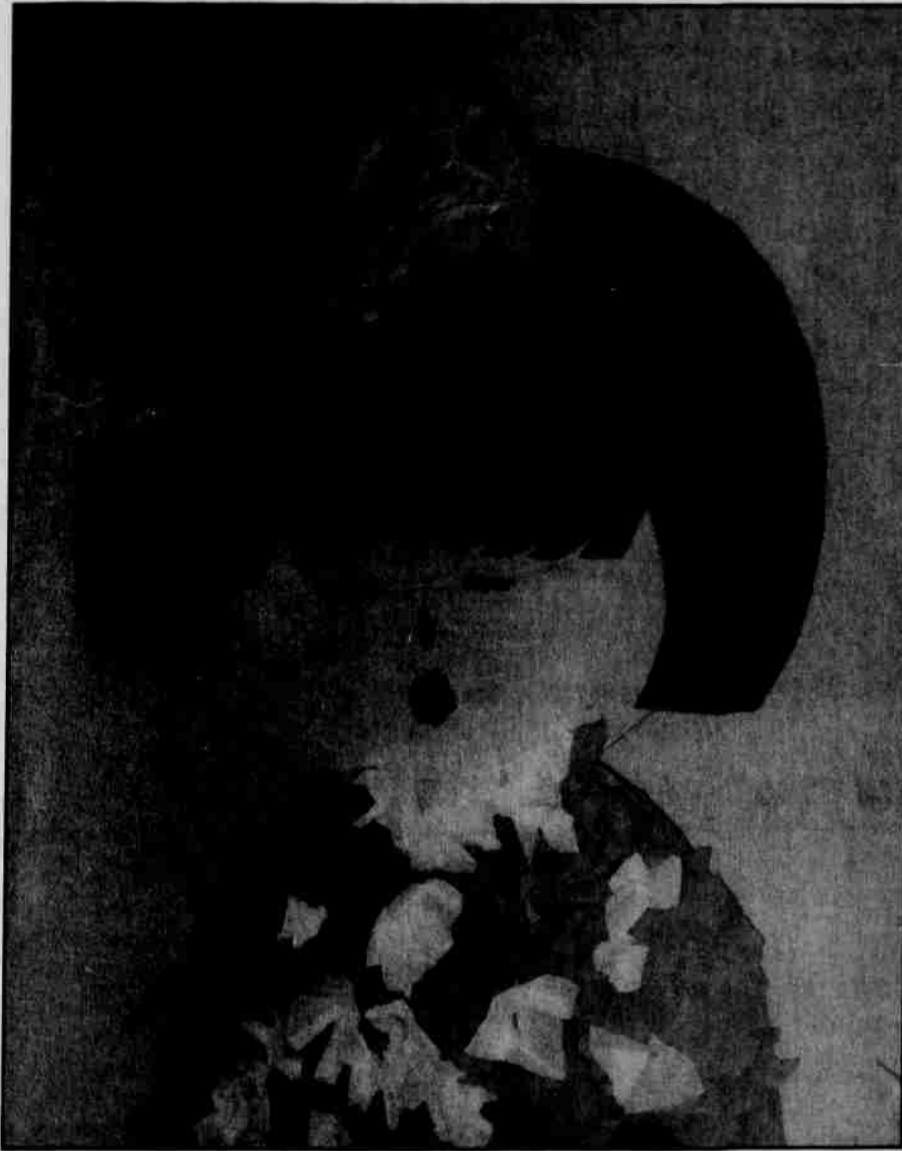


Museum featuring youth art

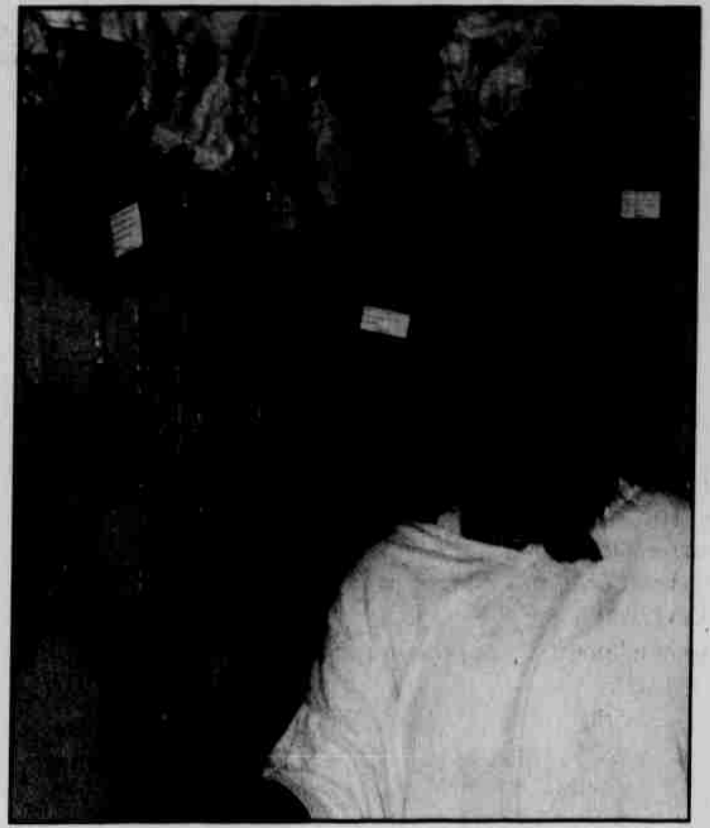


The Ninth Annual Tribal Youth Art Exhibit is now on display at The Museum at Warm Springs.

Job Announcement

Fish caretaker. Job Summary:

Contractor will assist the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon (CTWS) fisheries staff in implementing the Hood River Production Program (HRPP).

Contractor will provide labor for setup, maintenance and monitoring and protection of acclimation facilities for winter and summer steelhead and spring chinook salmon molts.

Responsibilities: Assemble portable fish acclimation ponds and the water intake and out-pipe systems at several locations; along with the HRPP fisheries staff.

Maintain fish acclimation ponds; provide care and feeding of fish; and sample and record fish information as described in acclimation daily tasks.

Water systems maintenance and operations.

Ability to repair, construct, or manufacture special tools, equipment, and/or (for fish culture use).

Expected to explain project information to the public.

Education: A high school diploma or the equivalent G.E.D.

Experience: Fisheries experience desired.

Skills: Good interpersonal skills. Able to follow direc-

tions both written and oral. Data recording.

Working conditions:

Applicants will be hired as self-employed subcontractors.

Applicant will be contracted to be at a remote job site in the Hood River sub basin 24 hrs/day; four days a week, working up to ten hour days and on call in the evenings.

A mobile trailer will be available on site.

Applicants must provide own food and transportation to and from the job site.

Required valid Oregon drivers license.

Automobile insurance required. Minimum - automobile liability insurance.

Minimum of 18 years of age.

Time Period: March 16 to May 15, 2002

Contracted Salary: \$2000/month salary
