Burglary suspects arrested

In a case related to a string of local burglaries, Warm Springs Police made several arrests on Tuesday, Feb. 5.

A total of ten people - juveniles as well as some adults - were arrested, said Jim Cole, Warm Springs Police Detective.

The arrests followed a police search at approximately 7 a.m. of a residence at 1202 Park Heights.

The SWAT team was used,

as one of the suspects at the residence was a suspect in an earlier shooting incident.

Also, police believed suspects were unlawfully in possession of firearms. An assault rifle was found in the house, said Cole.

Property from several burglaries in and around Warm Springs were also recovered, he said. While several people were taken into custody, more arrests are expected, he said.

The Defendant in this matter has the right to file an answer to the complaint prior to the hearing, however, he/she is not required to do so. The Defendant also has the right to file a counterclaim prior to the hearing. Any paper filed with

this court in conjunction with this case must be accompanied by the certification that the opposing party was served a copy of the same by the time the court filing was made.

If the defendant fails to appear at the hearing, the court may award the plaintiff a default judgment, which means the court can award the plaintiff all that is requested in the complaint.

If the plaintiff fails to appear at the hearing, the court may dismiss the case for lack of prosecution, allow the defendant to offer proof, or continue the case and reschedule the hearing.

If both parties fail to appear at the hearing, the court may dismiss the case with prejudice, or reschedule the hearing.

If you have any questions, you should seek legal counsel immediately. Failure to obtain legal counsel prior to the hearing is not sufficient cause to reschedule the hearing.
