Poisons pose risk to children

The Warm Springs Health and Wellness Center is providing this information as part of Poison Prevention Week, March 17-23.

What is a poison?

A poison is anything that could make you sick if you eat, drink, smell or touch it. Poisons come in all shapes, sizes, and forms. Many common household products can be poisonous, even salt — too much salt can change the body's fluid balance

Medicines, cosmetics, car products, cleaning supplies, arts and crafts materials, food

that is improperly prepared or stored, and plants are just a few household products that can cause poisonings.

Many poisonings occur in children under the age of six. Children are curious. They may think some poisons are good things to eat, drink, or play with.

As part of Poison Prevention Week, a team from IHS, CHET, and OSU Extension will be talking to the children at ECE about Poison prevention. There will be storytelling, games, and talk about ways to keep themselves safe from poi-

son.

Listen to KWSO for radio quizzes with prizes.

Here are some more tips. Stay alert. Children can't recognize poisons. Medicine may look like candy, and never refer to medicine as candy when trying to get a child to swallow their medicine.

Use child-resistant caps on medicines, cleaning products and antifreeze, but remember, these caps are not "child-proof."

Never store hazardous substances or medication in food or beverage containers.
