

Amshelglagwachgwa amigaben. Take good care of your root digger.


K'aya amaximaya amigaben amageldaql'ga. Don't put you digger down and leave it.

Language About Roots

Chi iwá Lukwsh. This is a root.

Awa luch'á psá. The skin is brown.

Áwa luch'a tmnátmna lukwshmi. The seeds of lukwsh are

brown.

Chi iwa Piaxi. This is the bitterroot.

Hahán áwa mxshpyát. The root-stem is green.



lwá Latitlatit. It is Indian Celery.

Awa mxshpyát ku olas xnit, ku psá áwa maik luc'á. The root is green, white, and the root skin is light red.

Latitlatitmi natit áwa mxsh. The flowers of the Indian Celery are yellow.




Maik luch'a psá áwa. The skin is light brown.

Natit áwa plas Sawitkmi. Indian carrot flowers are white.

Piaximi natit áwa walaswáakuł. Bitterroot flowers are pink.

> Wag'ámu iwa. It is Camas.

Waq'amumi natit áwa waq'amuwáakuł. Camas flowers are purple.
