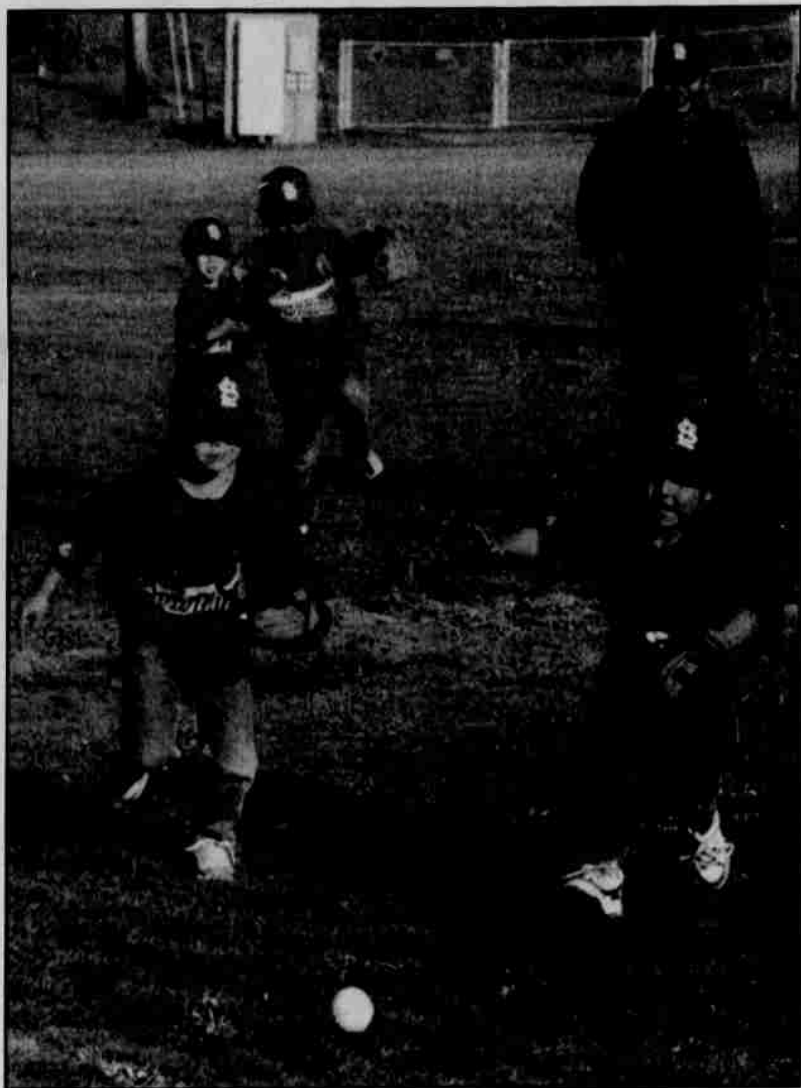
On race day, registration begins at 7:30 a.m., and the races begin at 8:30 a.m.
