## House fire leaves family needing help

David Suppah, who is from Warm Springs, and his family experienced a personal tragedy on New Year's Day. The family, living in Newport, saw their home and nearly all their possessions destroyed by fire.

The blaze broke out around 6 p.m. on Jan. 1, and destroyed the family's doublewide trailer and the contents of the home. Fortunately, no one was injured.

The family includes David and Misty Jay, and their children Jonelle, 16, Raina, 11, and Takoda, 4½ months of age.

David is working in Lincoln City at the Chinook Winds Casino. The Lincoln County Chapter of the Red Cross has provided some temporary assistance to the family, but the fire has left them in need.

On behalf of the family, an account has been established at the Newport branch of the Washington Mutual Bank.

## Emergency farm loans offered

The Secretary of Agriculture declared a natural disaster in Jefferson County due to losses caused by drought that occurred in September 2001, and losses that are continuing.

Family farmers in the county – as well as in neighboring Wasco, Wheeler, Crook and Deschutes counties – may be eligible for U.S. Department of Agriculture emergency loans.

The Farm Service Agency will consider each application on

its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available, repayment ability, inability to obtain credit elsewhere, and other eligibility requirements.

The final date to apply is July 21.
