Tribal Councilwoman Bernice Mitchell this month will conduct the blessing ceremony of a tribally owned business in Bend.

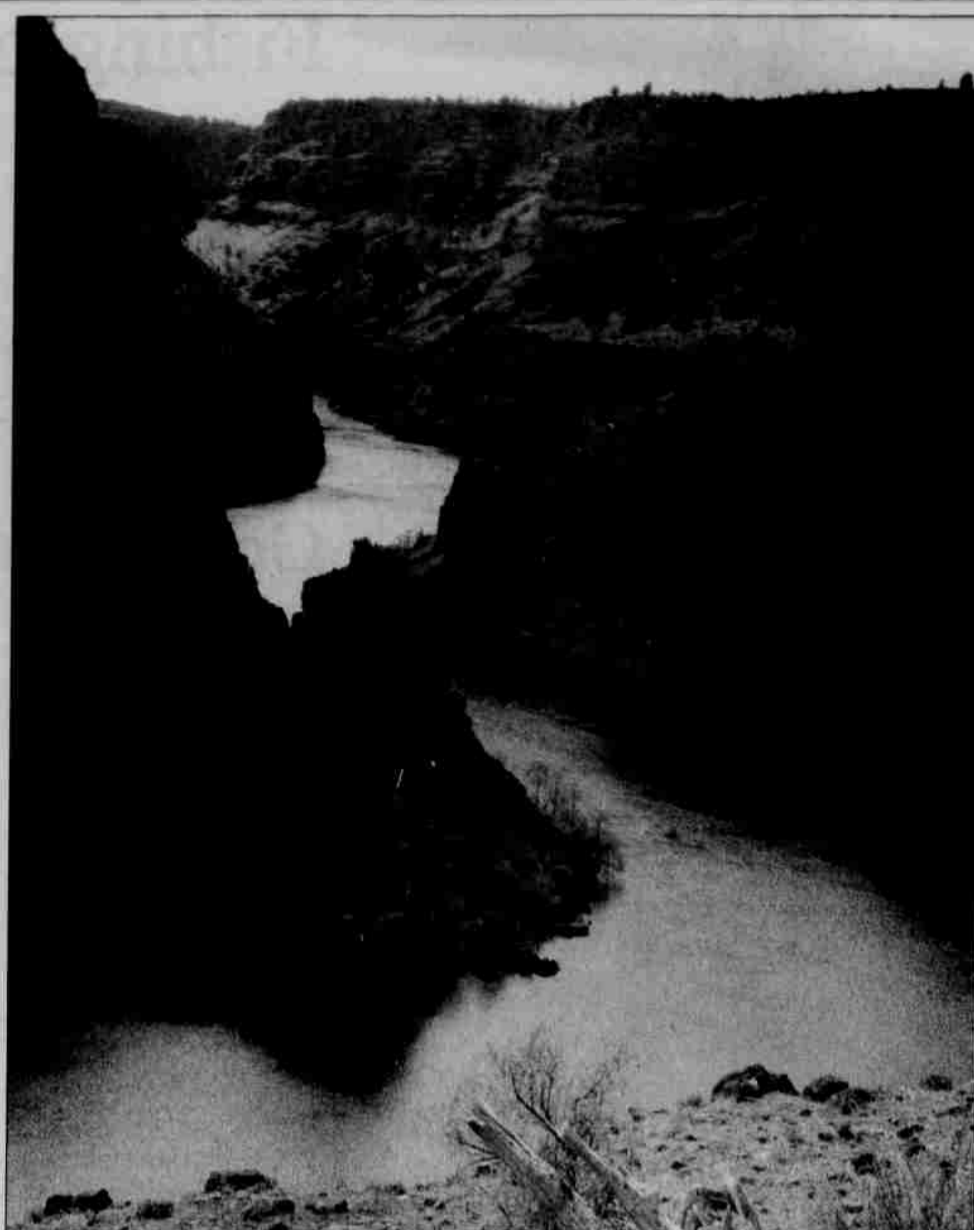
On April 25 Mitchell will conduct the blessing of Cort Directions, a payroll and human resources software company.
