
The Tribal Census begins the week of Oct. 6

The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs will be conducting the 2003 Tribal Census beginning the week of Oct. 6. The U.S. Census of 2000 significantly under counted Warm Springs, and it is critical to future planning to get an accurate count.

The U.S. Census determines billions of dollars of federal funding and Congressional representation. The 2003 Census will seek to interview not only Warm Springs tribal members but also those living in the community who are not enrolled.
