The hit resulted in a fumble and a touchdown for Madras.

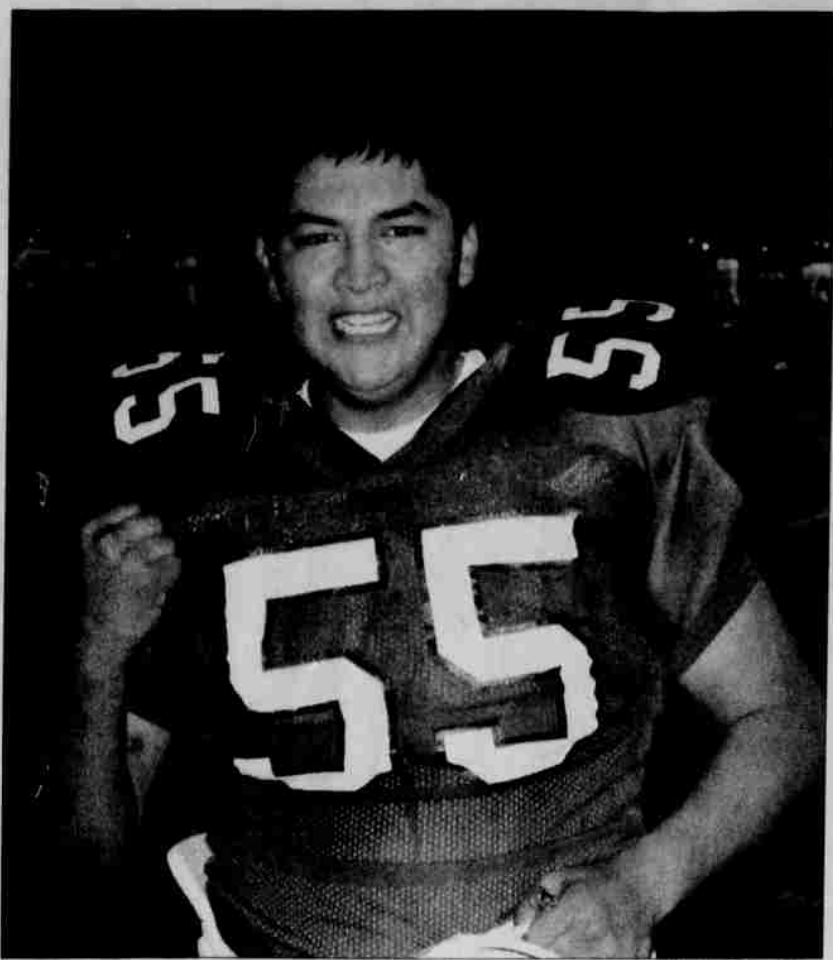
