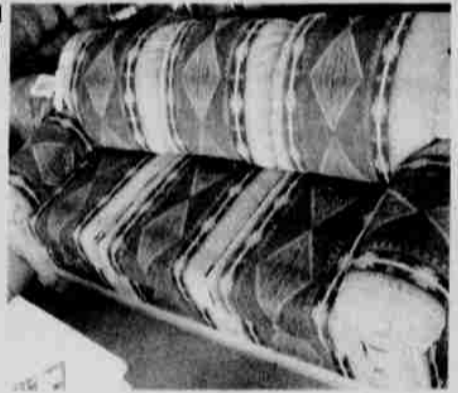
Native American teachers. Something Mitchell misses from her past is her freshman year at Cinderella Ball, a semi formal dance.
