There will be West Nile vaccination Springs and Simnasho rodeo grounds.

The clinics will be on Saturday, Sept. 25. At the Warm Springs rodeo grounds be available for purchase. the clinic will be from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. At the Simnasho rodeo grounds the clinic will be from 1 to 3 p.m.

If your horse has not been vaccinated for West Nile before, the animal will need an initial shot by the vet, cost of \$20, and a booster in three weeks (\$15), which the ver will give you to take home.

If your horse has been vaccinated clinics later this month at the Warm with an initial shot and follow-up booster in 2003, the animal will need an annual booster this year. These will

Oregon officials confirm first

(AP) - Oregon's first confirmed human case of West Nile virus has been found in a teenage boy, health officials said last Friday.

The boy probably was exposed to the disease last month when bitten by an infected mosquito, said Dr. Mel Kohn, the state epidemiologist.
