The demonstration will beheld in the museum's lobby from 1 to 5 p.m. Memorial Day Weekend, Saturday and Sunday, May 28-29.


An additional treat will be a dance performance that will take place at 2 p.m. on Sunday, May 29. The performance will be by Adeline Miller and the dance group, Unity.




