New bridge adds Kah-Nee-Ta access

The new Culpus Bridge over the Warm Springs River by Kah-Nee-Ta is complete.

The project took nearly a year to finish, at a cost of \$1.4 million.

The new bridge provides improved access to the east end of Kah-Nee-Ta, and can serve as a second main access to the resort and casino.

The bridge is located at the cast end of Webster Flat Road, off Route 3 past Wolf Point.

This alternate route should improve driving safety for employees and guests of the resort during icy winter months.


The BIA provided the funding for the new bridge, designed by Anderson-Perry Inc. of LaGrande.

The tribal Engineering Department administered the project, with the tribal Construction Enterprise, as the main contractor, doing much of the work.

There is still BIA money left for bridge projects on the reservation. The money will be used to design and construct four more small bridges: the Upper Mill Creek Bridge, the

Whitewater River Bridge, the HeHe Bridge, and one more bridge yet to be determined.

The new Culpus Bridge includes paved paths for use by pedestrians and bicyclists. Also, an improved kayak takeout access road was included as part of the project.
