with your symptoms.

With the current news spotlight on pseudoephedrine and methamphetamine, there have been many questions asked about how Warm Springs Pharmacy handles this medication.

We would like you to know that the Warm Springs Pharmacy will continue to keep this medication "behind the pharmacy counter" and limit the amount given, since it takes large quantities of pseudoephedrine to produce methamphetamine. We have not seen excessive use of pseudoephedrine at the pharmacy.

If you feel like you have a cold, consider home remedies. Drinking plenty of fluids, eating a healthy diet, getting plenty of rest, and using a humidifier


can help with your cold symptoms. If your symptoms last longer than seven days or become severe, consider seeing your doctor.

Our pharmacist will be happy to provide you with the medications you need to help with your symptoms.


