OSU Extension continues 'On the Road' at Seekseequa

The OSU Extension Service at Warm Springs will continue its "On The Road Again" series at the Seekseequa Fire Hall on Thursday, April 6. There will be a dinner and an assortment of activities for the family offered by the OSU Extension staff.

Dinner is at 6 p.m., followed by a Master Gardner demonstration and activities from Extension Home Economics, 4-H, and Agriculture.

Master Gardener Brigitte Whipple will present "Growing Starts Indoors and Garden Starting Tips." Home Economics Agent Emilee Hugie presents a surprising activity. Arlene Boileau and Minnie Tulalakus from 4-H show children how to create homemade beads from dough, and Fara Currim offers a show-and-tell about livestock nutrition, including feeds and feeding.

Horse care clinic at rodeo grounds

The Spring Horse Care and Vaccination Clinic is at the Warm Springs Rodeo Grounds from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Fri., April 7.

The clinic is offered to all tribal horse owners by the Warm Springs tribal Range and Agriculture Department, Oregon State University Extension Service, and U.S. Department of Agriculture Veterinary Services and offers Coggins testing by the U.S.D.A. veterinarian.

Several vaccinations are offered at cost, including shots for West Nile (\$12 for first shot, \$10 for booster), and four-way vaccination for \$7 a shot, which covers Eastern and Western sleeping sickness, influenza, and tetanus.

Wormer is available for purchase at \$3 per 10 cc. The recommended dose is 10 cc. per 1,100 pounds. The wormer is a liquid horse ivermectin.

Horse owners need not bring their horses to the clinic to purchase the wormer, four-way shot, or West Nile booster shot.

Any horse owner who plans to bring more than two horse is asked to call the OSU Extension Service office in Warm Springs at 553-3238.

Kids rodeo series kicks off in May

The Squiemphen-Yazzie Kids Rodeo Series kicks off on Saturday, May 20, at the Warm Springs Rodeo Grounds.

There rodeo series will continue on June 18, July 4, and August 19.
