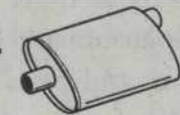

*Root gathering is a tradition of the  
Confederated Tribes since time immemorial.  
Root digging season is an important  
traditional time of year for the tribes – a time  
when Elders teach the youth the skills of  
locating the roots, digging them, and leaving  
the ground in a way that ensures a good  
harvest in years to come. The season began in  
March with the Root Feast, and continues for  
the next several weeks. Tribal members gather a  
variety of roots from areas on the reservation,  
and from the Ceded Lands of the region.*
