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Committee, board vacancies

The Tribal Council of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon, would like to advertise the following:

Culture and Heritage Committee: One tribal member position, Wasco. Person should be community oriented and possess a positive rapport with the community. Must have an interest in the tribal culture and heritage. Understanding and appreciation of and the capability to interpret traditional activities of the community. Possess sound understanding of the tribal organizational structure and functions. Member of the Wasco tribe.

Health and Welfare Committee: One tribal member position. Review and recommend to the Tribal Council on health and welfare service delivery systems, legislation development and implementation on federal and state levels. Review policies affecting health and welfare services to tribal members. Direction of service systems, proposed projects and comprehensive health planning methods.

Land Use Planning Committee: One tribal member position. Review requests for land use permits, zoning ordinance changes and possible comprehensive plan updates. Willing to work with other committees on updates on the IRMP.

Range, Irrigation and Agriculture Committee: One tribal member position. Review and recommend to the Tribal Council on range ordinances, review proposed range units, programs and projects. Review conditional use permit applications, enforcement of regulations and water resource development on ranges.

Timber Committee: One tribal member position. Review and recommend to the Tribal Council on policies in regard to timber permits, sales of timber/forest products not more than 30 mbf, review of areas to be logged, methods of harvest and utilization. Review and recommend environmental protections laws, tribal and federal management plans.

Fish and Wildlife (On-Reservation) Committee: One tribal member position. Person should be able to review and recommend to the Tribal Council on hunting and fishing seasons and regulations for on-reservation. Review fish and wildlife management regulations annually, and land use proposals for impact on fish and wildlife.

(All committees should be able to review and recommend to the Tribal Council on changes/amendments on the integrated resource management plan (IRMP I) – forested area; IRMP II, the non-forested and rural areas; assist with (IRMP-III) plan for the community, commercial and industrial areas.)

Water Board: one tribal member position. Water control board to regulate water uses and quality, the adoption of in-stream flows and water quality standards for reservation water resources, and the adoption of numerous other plans directed to protection and enhancement of water.
