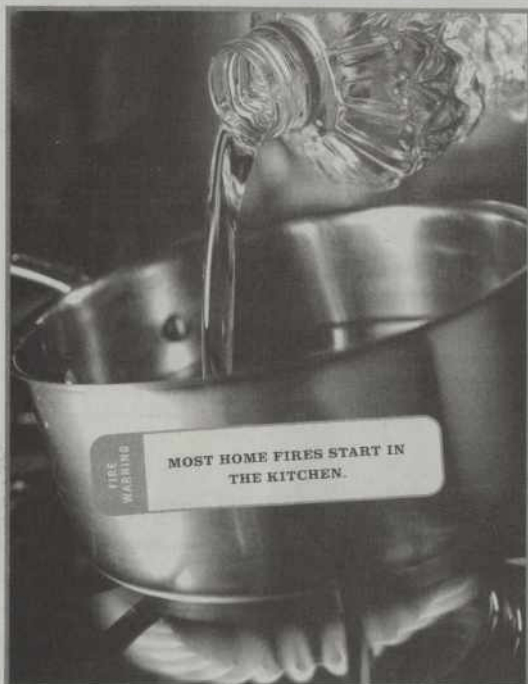
Fire Prevention Week

Fire Prevention Week is Oct. 8-14, and Warm Springs Fire and Safety has activities, including a chance for students to win prizes, planned for the week.

Warm Springs Elementary School students will receive Fire Busters worksheets. Students who complete the worksheets and turn them in have a chance to win one of two bikes.

There will be an Open House at Fire and Safety, 2112 Wasco Street, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 12.

There will be equipment demonstrations, a comparison of old equipment to new, and a demonstration on how to use a fire extinguisher. There will also be free hot dogs.



What to do if one starts in yours: Never put water on a grease or oil fire. Keep a lid handy when cooking. If a fire starts in a pan, turn off the burner and carefully slide the lid over the pan to extinguish the fire. Don't run outside with the burning pot. Keep a fire extinguisher in the kitchen. If the fire continues, leave the home and call 9-1-1.
