For those families living outside the community, if you bring candy, there will be a place where you can hand out the candy to the trick-or-treaters.

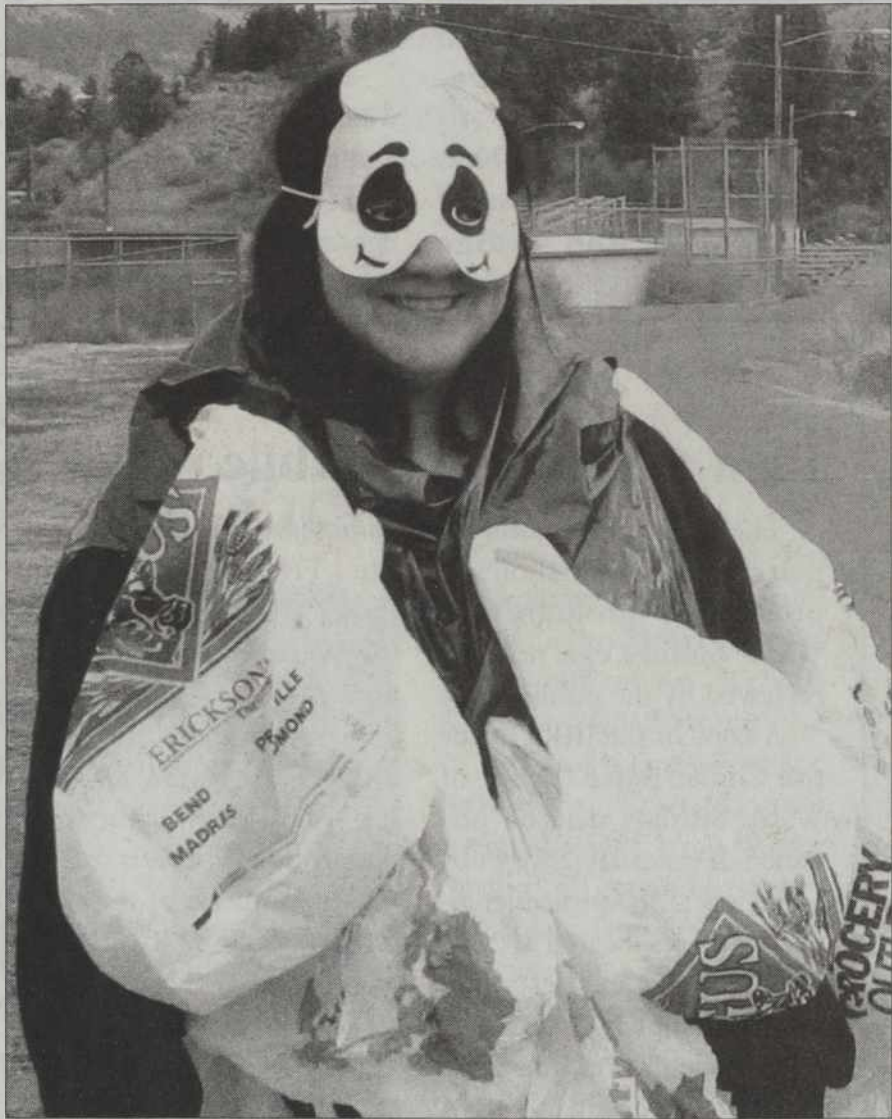
Potluck dinner at the longhouse begins at 6:30 p.m.
