Hermiston is leading the Intermountain League with a six win and zero loss record. The loss for the Buffs puts them in a tie for second place with a 4-2

record. Jansen Harrington and A.J. Adams led the scoring for Madras as each had 14 points apiece.

The Bulldogs out scored the Buffs at the end of the first quarter 26-20 and led at half time 53-38. The Buffs got a total of 15 three-pointers during the game, but that wasn't enough to catch the Bulldogs.
