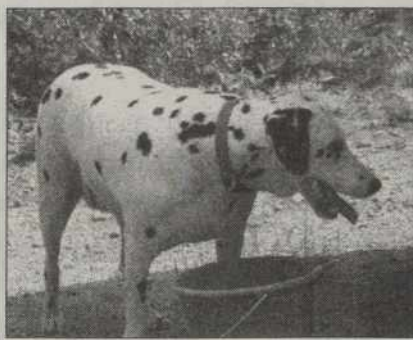

Notice of Intent to Repatriate

The National Museum of Natural History of the Smithsonian Institution plans to repatriate the following to the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation and the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation and.

Ten funerary objects were collected from the Memaloose Islands, Washington and Oregon, by Mr. Joseph Simms, and donated to

the Smithsonian in 1921.

The Repatriation Office of the National Museum of Natural History has determined that these objects are unassociated funerary objects and are culturally affiliated with the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation and the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation.

These unassociated funerary objects will be repatriated to the Confederated Tribes of the

Warm Springs Reservation and the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation.
