Resource team approves projects

The Resource Management Interdisciplinary Team (RMIDT) recently approved categorical exclusions for timber salvage operations, spring burning projects, and a new manufacturing facility for Warm Springs Composite Products.

RMIDT passed resolutions to approve salvage of timber blown down during winter storms at three primary locations. As a result of RMIDT's action, windthrown timber will be salvaged near Bear Springs, Boxwood and Southgate sale areas in the weeks and months ahead. Strong winds blew over more trees that usual this past winter and the Branch of Forestry made the request to recover trees that will provide an economic benefit to the Confederated Tribes.

The Bear Springs salvage will target a volume of approximately 60,000 board feet of salvage timber, Boxwood would contribute approximately 50,000 board feet, and Southgate approximately 100,000 board feet.

Four areas were approved for spring burning projects under the Cat-X process, including Peters Spring (2,200 acres), Tenino '05 (1,169 acres), Tenino '06 (1,428 acres) and Lower Mutton (940 acres). The burns will reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire by consuming hazardous fuels and help reintroduce the natural element of fire to the ecosystem.

RMIDT also approved a Cat-X to construct a 50,000 square foot manufacturing facility for Warm Springs Composite Products at the Industrial Park lots 13, 14 and 15. The plant will employ 20-30 people and the building will be designed for potential future expansion.

All of the projects approved by RMIDT were subject to mitigation that will protect natural and cultural resources.

Bush administration again opposes Mount Hood wilderness expansion

The Bush administration said last week it opposes a plan to expand the Mount Hood wilderness area _ the second time in as many years the administration has opposed plans to increase wilderness protections on Oregon's highest peak.

Oregon Sens. Ron Wyden and Gordon Smith proposed the wilderness expansion in February. The plan would extend wilderness protection to an additional 128,600 acres surrounding Mount Hood and the Columbia River Gorge. The bill would increase existing wilderness protection on the mountain by about two-thirds and add "wild and scenic" protection to nearly 80 miles of rivers.

The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs has supported the plan, but preferred an earlier proposal.

Ron Suppah, chairman of tribes, testified this year in favor of the bill, but said the tribe was concerned that some protections built into last year's bill were re-

Specifically, Suppah said the tribe was worried that wilderness protections in the Columbia Gorge could be extended close to the city of Cascade Locks, where the tribes are planning to build a casino and re-

"Full wilderness designation on the very face of the ridge running down toward the city of Cascade Locks could unduly constrain the city's economic options," Suppah said.

Agriculture Undersecretary Mark Rev, who directs U.S. forest policy, said the Bush administration opposes the wilderness bill as drafted, saying it moves to seal off more land than is appropriate and includes an unacceptable land swap.

"While we strongly support public involvement and community collaboration, the concept of legislating management direction (on the mountain) is problematic," Rey told a Senate subcommittee, "We find the land exchange provisions and several of the wilderness designations to be especially trou-

Most of the areas proposed for protection are adjacent to existing ones to reduce potential conflicts with other recreational uses, said Sens. Smith and Wyden.

Wyden, a Democrat, and Smith, a Republican, also introduced a bill last year to bring 128,400 acres of the Mount Hood National Forest into wilderness areas, but the plan was never voted on by the full Senate. The House passed a smaller wilderness bill that also died. This year, House members from Oregon are waiting for the Senate to act before introducing their own bill.

The previous Senate bill ran into trouble when the Bush administration questioned the amount of acreage involved and a proposed land exchange involving the owners of the Mt. Hood Meadows ski area _ the same concerns Rey raised Thurs-

Rey said the administration could support as much as 59,000 acres of new wilderness on Mount Hood, but believes the current plan is too expansive.

He also questioned the land swap, saying that to protect the public's investment, new appraisals should be performed, rather than relying on previous reports. He also said Agriculture Secretary Mike Johanns should have final say over the appraisal.

Karin Sandberg is working with Jensen on the filming project and also recently traveled to HeHe.

"It's a very important work that is going on here," Sandberg said.

In Sandberg's opinion, "It's a good feeling to see that everyone is welcome here."

"There's a mixture of pain and a lot of love at the same time," Jensen said.
