Interior official visits reservation

Lynn Scarlett, Deputy Secretary of the Interior, recently visited Warm Springs and toured a variety of locations on the reservation.

Scarlett spent an evening at the Kah-Nee-Ta Resort and then traveled to Warm Springs Power and Water Enterprises to be briefed on the upcoming Pelton Fish Passage Project as well as potential alternative energy develop-

ment. After a briefing on forest protection act efforts and the tribal perspective on biomass, Scarlett toured the forests outside of Sidwalter with various tribal representatives.

The tour was a chance for the tribes to demonstrate to Scarlett the process of thinning the forests in order to reduce the fuel source for wildfires.

Three master-apprentice teams awarded

Three groups of masters and apprentices from the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs were chosen for the 2007 Traditional Arts of the Oregon Historical Society.

The Traditional Arts Apprenticeships program is part of the Historical Society Folklife Program. The masters and apprentices chosen from the Confederated Tribes are:

Adeline Miller, who will train Merle Kirk in storytelling;

Sahaptin speaker Suzie Slockish, who will teach Washaata songs to Roberta Kirk;

Chinook Wasco speaker Viola L. Kalama will instruct Brigitte M. Whipple in the making of willow baskets.

As a way of supporting tribal language programs, the Histori-

cal Society this year again chose masters who are master artists and also fluent speakers in their indigenous languages.

The Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Program awards monetary stipends to master folk artists to teach a specific tradition to one or more apprentice from within the same culture.

A master artist is someone who is considered an exceptional practitioner of an art – craft, music, dance and oral traditions – that has been passed down over generations within a cultural community.

This year the masters will team their art forms while speaking the Native language, giving apprentices the opportunity to learn both cultural forms and supporting tribal cultural

preservation efforts. Since 1990, the Historical Society Folklife Program has presented 140 of the awards, encouraging people to preserve traditions and art forms in communities.

Besides the Warm Springs apprentices and masters, this year the Traditional Arts Apprenticeships went to Patricia Whereat-Phillips of the Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw Indians, who will work with John Cauthorn and other tribal members on stories in the Siuslaw language.

The 2007 Traditional Arts Apprenticeships are made possible by the National Endowment for the Arts, and the Oregon Arts Commission.
