Only five percent of the eligible population donates blood.

Fireworks, parade planned for Fourth

Warm Springs will celebrate the Fourth of July this year with a parade, barbecue, kids games and fireworks.

The parade begins at 10 a.m. in front of the old boys dorm on the Campus. Line-up begins about 9 a.m. The theme of the parade this year is "War Bonnets and Wind Talkers."

The parade travels from the old boys dorm to the Community Center, where the rest of the activities take place. The fireworks begin just after sundown.

The Warm Springs Community Health Education Team

(CHET) is wishing everyone a safe Fourth of July. CHET wishes to point out the following safety information regarding fireworks:

There are more fires reported on July 4 than on any other day of the year, and fireworks account for half of those fires, more than any other cause.

During a recent Fourth of July, emergency rooms in the U.S. treated 10,800 people for fireworks related injuries: 48 percent of the injuries were to the person's extremities, and 44 percent were to the person's

head. Males accounted for 69 percent of fireworks injuries, according to the most recent statistics. The risk of fireworks injury was nearly three times as high for children ages 10-14 as for the general population.

During a recent Fourth of July, across the U.S. there were a report 1,500 structure fires, and 600 vehicle fires. Nine hundred home fires were attributed to fireworks, according to recent statistics. CHET encourages Warm Springs to have a fun, and safe Fourth of July.

Resource team approves five projects

The Resource Management Interdisciplinary Team (RMIDT) recently approved five projects through the small project approval (SPA) process. The projects cover improvements to the Happy Valley Reservoir road, two phases of Sunnyside Subdivision, and placement of large wood in the Deschutes and Metolius rivers.

RMIDT unanimously passed a resolution to approve a project involving improvement of the road leading to Happy Valley Reservoir. The project will include numerous improvements to the road, a new parking area at the reservoir, and an erosion control plan. Since portions of the project are within an area designated as conditional use, RMIDT will present the proposal to Tribal Council for their approval.

RMIDT approved two SPAs that will expand development of the Sunnyside Subdivision as Phase 2 and Phase 3. Under Phase 2, expected to be implemented in 2009, an additional 31 lots will be added to the subdivision.

Two more SPAs involving the placement of large wood in the Deschutes and Metolius rivers also passed with broad-based support from RMIDT. Wood placement is part of an ongoing effort to improve fish habitat in the vicinity of the Pelton-Round Butte hydroelectric project, which was recently re-licensed through the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. The re-licensing effort included a number of projects to improve fish habitat and passage of anadromous fish around the Pelton-Round Butte dams.
