grader, six 7th-graders, and one 8th-grader. Average height of each player is about 5 feet. Her team played up to the junior varsity level, bypassing the younger middle school division.

Surprisingly, her team - after eight hard-fought games against top-notch 6-A high school competition - won an amazing championship against Clackamas High School.

Clackamas by the way had three team members who played this season in the girls 6-A OSAA State Championship game against, of course, Southridge, who have been the girls state OSAA 6-A champs in 2005, 2006 and again in 2007.

If that doesn't say a lot about the skills these middle schoolers have, then you better go see for yourself. One of the biggest tournaments of the year is at Oregon City High School on June 29-July 1. It's a nationally recognized tourney. Hope to see the locals there.

To sum things up, Abby Scott is a very humble athlete. She practices hard. She believes in herself. Her message to her friends is to stay on the right path and good things will eventually come your way.

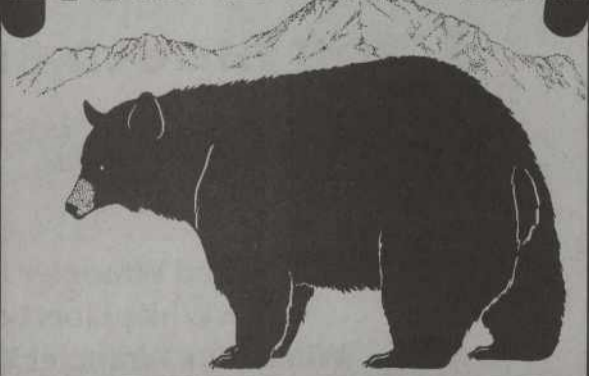
