Garden: future plans already blossoming

They're even looking at the possibility of donating some to a farmer's market for youth.

For many, the garden is also providing newfound skills.

"A lot of us are still just learning," Clements said.

"There's a lot of personal time and effort that is going into this from individuals," Clements said.

In her opinion, those individuals are going to see a lot of benefits from the garden.

"It's healthy," Clements said. "It'll teach people how to grow and nurture something healthy that they've been responsible for."

In addition, she said, they're hoping to rekindle the tradition of having a garden, which is being lost as generations pass.

"It would be nice to get that back again," she said.

Planning for the garden originally began in April, Clements said, when interested departments began getting together to discuss options for the garden.

The Tenino Garden is ahead of some other community gardens, Clements said, because they already had the space available where a community garden had been in place in the past near the Administration Building.

The first community garden began in 1999, but ended three years later when grant money ran out.

Eventually Clements said they hope to create more raised beds so that the garden will be easier to access for elders and other people who may have a hard time reaching things at ground level.

Beamer said they would also like to build a bridge across Tenino Creek. At some point, she said, it would be ideal to build a greenhouse so that plants can be started inside earlier to prolong the growing season.

At some point, Clements said, they might even be able to put in trees and picnic tables to create a relaxing area for the community.

And that's not the end of their future plans—they're hoping to grow enough corn for a larger project during a fall season.

"The goal is to have a big corn field so we can do a maze," Clements said. They also hope to someday have a pumpkin patch.

In Clements' opinion, Beamer deserves a lot of credit for her part in the process. "She's really been an inspiration for the whole garden," Clements said.

Those involved with the project are hoping that community members take advantage of the garden.

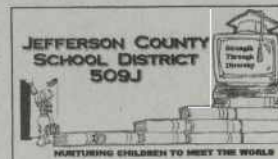
"We just would like to invite anybody to come down," Clements said. "It's not just a selective or private garden, it's a community garden."

"It's getting close to being too late to start anything," Clements said, but added that anyone is welcome to lend a helping hand in other ways.

Departments working together to create the garden include: the Community Health Improvement Partnership, the Diabetes Prevention Program, Utilities, CHET, Community Counseling, the Boys and Girls Club, KWSO, and the OSU extension office. Besides individual community members, Clements said inmates from the Warm Springs Correctional Facility have even helped out.

Though the types of help are varied, the goal is the same. "We're really hoping to fix it up and keep it going," Clements said.
