Entries will be accepted until July 24. Brigette Whipple is serving as the superintendent for the Native American department for the third year in a row.

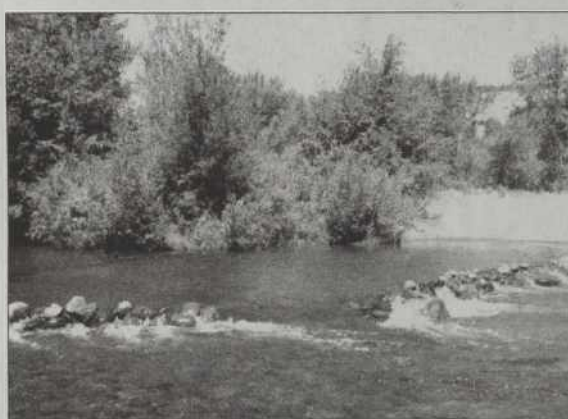

Volunteers will sit at the informational booth from 10 a.m. until 8 p.m. for two-hour shifts.

Please ensure that recreational dams do not block fish passage

Swimmers hoping to find a way to escape summer heat should keep one thing in mind: migrating fish.

Recreational dams that swimmers build can often hinder the upstream migration of fish.

While some barriers can make it difficult for fish to pass by, the problem can be easily solved.

Lisa Hewlett, a fish biologist with Natural Resources, suggests that a two-foot gap be left in dams, particularly in the deep portions of the main channel.

If anyone has questions or concerns about leaving enough room in the recreation dam or about potential salmon spawning habitat, people are encouraged to call Hewlett at 553-2029.
