On Saturday the workshop will be from 6 to 9 p.m., and on Sunday, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The Crossing2Freedom Healing Workshop is open to men, women and teens. The workshop will open your eyes to the truth about yourself, so you can let go and move on to the joy or real freedom.

Crossing2Freedom is a "relationship" teaching seminar for healing wounded hearts.

Whether you want to improve your relationship with Christ, yourself, your spouse, or others, this teaching will help you.

Trouble spots are recognized, dealt with through prayer and ministering and then released

into Jesus' capable hands. Only then are we free to grow into a deeper understanding of God's will for our lives.

The complete seminar is made up of four sessions that cover many different topics.
