the case, you may have a legal aide, spokesperson or attorney appear on your behalf at your expense. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately.

Restraining orders

Thelma Mae Dickson, petitioner, vs. Melvin Scott Sr., respondent. Case no. RO88-07.

On the 31st day of August, 2007, the court issued and ex parte temporary restraining order in the above captioned case enjoining the above named respondent from contacting petitioner in any manner and at certain places within the Warm Springs Reservation until a hearing could be held to determine whether respondent should be further restrained from petitioner. On the 17th day of September, 2007, at 11 a.m. the court held such hearing and finds the following: Petitioner appeared in person or by representation VOC's Mark Matthews. Respondent did not appear. Both parties having proper notice and opportunity to be heard, the court finds that there is sufficient evidence to further enjoin respondent from contact with petitioner, and hereby orders that:

The restraining order against the respondent is continued until the 29th day of October, 2007 at 11 a.m., as set out in the ex parte re-

straining order; and, the following conditions are added to the same: No contact of any kind or manner, no third party contact; no telephone calls, or mail; no contact in any of the following counties: Jefferson and Wasco and/or any place in the state of Oregon. So ordered by the Tribal Court on Sept. 17, 2007.

Gail Frank, petitioner, vs. Warran Wallulatum Jr., respondent. Case no. RO86-07.

On the 27th day of August, 2007, the court issued and ex parte temporary restraining order in the above captioned case enjoining the above named respondent from contacting petitioner in any manner and at certain places within the Warm Springs Reservation until a hearing could be held to determine whether respondent should be further restrained from petitioner. On the 11th day of September, 2007, at 11 a.m. the court held such hearing and finds the following: Petitioner appeared in person or by represen-

tation VOC's Mark Matthews. Respondent did not appear. Both parties having proper notice and opportunity to be heard, the court finds that there is sufficient evidence to further enjoin respondent from contact with petitioner, and hereby orders that:

The restraining order against the respondent is continued until the 30th day of October, 2007 at 11 a.m., as set out in the ex parte restraining order; and, the following conditions are added to the same: This show cause being scheduled for Sept. 11, 2007 at 11 a.m. and due to no proof of service on the respondent, the restraining order is granted/continued and respondent will be served by public notice: Respondent is to refrain himself from petitioner at: Residence 4116 Miller Hts.; no direct or third party contact on the reservation; no contact in the following counties: Jefferson, Wasco, Deschutes. Ordered by the Tribal Court on Sept. 11, 2007.
