All children ages 6 months to 5 years. Anyone 50 years of age or older.

Anyone 6 months to 18 years old on long-term aspirin treatment. Women who will be pregnant during flu season.

Anyone with long-term health problems. Anyone with a weak immune system.

Residents of nursing homes and long-term care facilities. Health care workers.

Household contacts and care-givers of children birth to 5 years, of adults 50 and older with medical conditions.

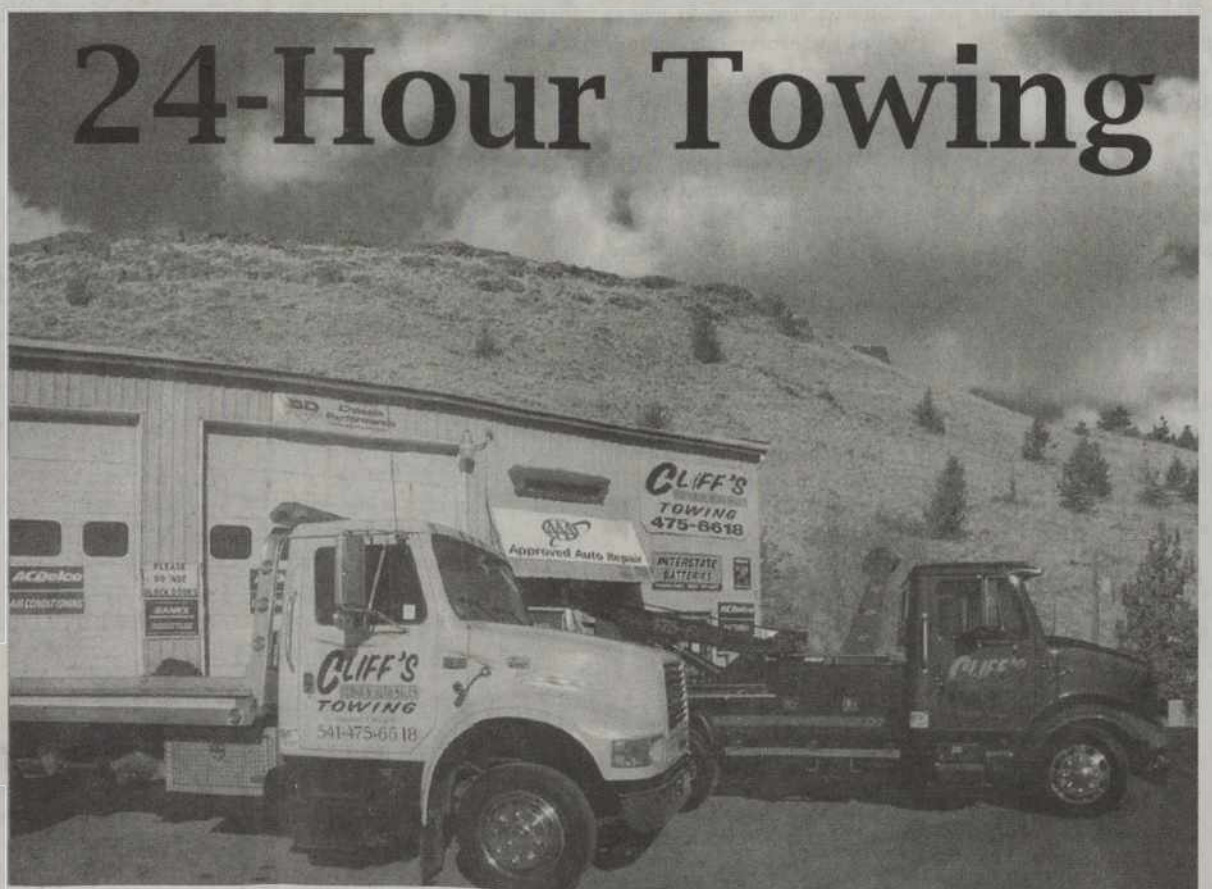
