## In the Tribal Court of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs

**Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon vs. Virgil Orange Jr., defendant. Case no. CV46-97. To Virgil Orange Jr.:** You are hereby notified that the above cited case, as filed in the Warm Springs Tribal Court has been scheduled for a show cause hearing at 10 a.m. on January 18, 2008. You are hereby ordered to be and appear at the Warm Springs Tribal Court at the time and date shown, to show cause for failing to appear on a Debtor's Exam. This hearing will not be a full hearing on the merits of the case, you must appear and defend a complaint that you failed to obey the order of the court. If you fail to appear as so ordered, the Tribal Court shall enter a complaint for contempt of court and issue a warrant for your arrest. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately.

**Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon vs. Michelle Chavez, defendant. Case no. CV166-06. To Michelle Chavez:** You are hereby notified that the above cited case, as filed in the Warm Springs Tribal Court, has been scheduled for a hearing at 11 a.m. on November 30, 2007. You are hereby ordered to be and appear at the Warm Springs Tribal Court at the time and date shown to defend against the charge(s). You may be represented by yourself, by an attorney, or by a spokesperson, at your own expense. You may bring any documents you believe are relevant to this cause, and you may bring witnesses to testify on your behalf. You may request the court to subpoena you witnesses; however,

you must submit your list of witnesses no later than two weeks prior to trial; failure to do so will not be considered sufficient reason to postpone the trial. If you have questions, you should seek legal advice immediately. If you fail to appear as so ordered, the Tribal Court may enter a default judgment against you and issue an exclusion order.
