Notice is further given that all persons having claims against the decedent's estate are required to present their claims, with proper voucher, to the Warm Springs Tribal Probate, PO Box 850, Warm Springs, 97761 within 90 days from the date upon which this notice was first posted. Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon vs. Martina Stwyer, defendant, case no. CR753-06. To Martina Stwyer:

You are hereby notified that the above cited case, as filed in the Warm Springs Tribal Court, has been scheduled for a trial/hearing at 9 a.m. on **December 18, 2007.** You are hereby ordered to be and appear at the Warm Springs Tribal Court at the time and date shown to defend against the charge(s). You may be represented by yourself, by an attorney, or by a spokesperson at your own expense. You may bring any documents you believe are relevant to this cause, and you may bring witnesses to testify on your behalf. You may request the court to subpoena you witnesses; however, you must submit your list of witnesses no later than two weeks prior to trial; failure to do so will not be considered sufficient reason to postpone the trial. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately. If you fail to appear as so ordered, the Tribal Court may enter a complaint for contempt of court and issue a warrant for your arrest.

To Tom Ward: You are hereby notified that a petition for civil complaint has been filed with the Warm Springs Tribal Court. If you desire to personally argue your side of the case, you may have a legal aide, spokesperson or attorney appear on your behalf at your expense. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately.
