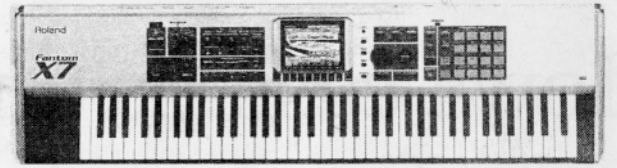

Warm Springs Confederated Tribes, plaintiff, vs. Michelle Chavez, defendant, case no. CV166-06. It is hereby ordered and judged that the defendant is excluded permanently from the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. Compliance with this exclusion order may be en-

forced by the contempt power of the tribal court in accordance with Chapter 200 of the Warm Springs Tribal Code. If the defendant is found on the reservation in violation of this exclusion order, the court may impose jail, fine or both for contempt of court, in addition to violations

of Warm Springs Tribal Code Chapter 300, the tribal exclusion code. This exclusion order was made in Tribal Court on November 30, 2007 with the defendant served for court and failing to appear. Dated Dec. 17, 2007.
