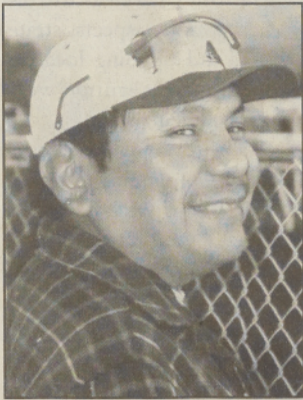
Lowell E. Spino, "Nenocken," 1959-2008

Lowell Emery Spino, Indian name Nenocken, entered into eternal rest early Monday morning, February 11, 2008.

Many of his family and friends knew him by his nickname "Fuzz" or "Judge Lowell." He was a true warrior who succumbed to cancer and he will be missed. He was of Yakama and Umatilla descent.

He was born November 22, 1959 at the Spino family home in Adams, Oregon. His education began at Adams grade school, then junior high at John Murray and Helen McCune, he also attended Pendleton High School.

Among his many hobbies and interests he loved watching and participating in rodeo, baseball, golf, horseshoes, 3D shoot, bow hunting, beadwork, featherwork, gill and dip net fishing on the Columbia River at traditional Native sites, wildhorse racer, men's pool league, and breaking and training horses for



family and friends.

He was a highly skilled and avid hunter and fisherman who provided meat and salmon for his family, tribal elders and for ceremonies when he was called upon.

In his youth and teenage years, he was a champion fancy dancer, traveling the Pow Wow trail in the Pacific Northwest.

He loved spending time with family and friends. He was a proud and devoted father to his son Stanley.

He was employed by the Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Indian Reservation

(CTUIR) Maintenance Department for 13 years, and the CTUIR Transfer Recycling Facility.

Over the years, he worked at CTUIR in several different departments: landscape and maintenance crew, tribal fisheries, firefighter, Smith's Cannery, and the Alaska Pipeline.

He is survived by long-time companion Melinda Alexander and son Stanley, mother Lillian Spino of Pendleton; brothers Lester Spino or Pendleton, Lawrence Spino of Pendleton, and Leslie Spino of Warm Springs; sisters, Laura Spino Kordatzky, Leona F. Spino, Lenora Spino all of Pendleton, Luella Spino Azule of Salem, and Louise Spino Paxton of Gastonia, North Carolina, and numerous aunts, uncles, nephews and nieces.

He was preceded in death by his father Lewis P. Spino, grandparents George and Maude Spino, and Jim and Mary Shock.

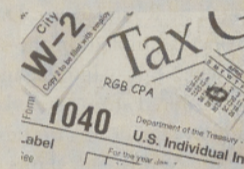
