The Saturday performance is designated as a tour rodeo in which contestants compete for triple points and a larger purse.

The points won during the year are what quality the contestants for the National Finals in Winnemucca, Nevada, Nov. 4-9.

The Redmond Rodeo was voted Rodeo of the Year in 2007 out of 80-plus Senior Pro Rodeos in the U.S. and Canada.

chased at the Spotted Mule in Bend and Saddle Up Saddlery in Redmond for \$7 and kids 6 years and under are free.

There is also a Ride-N-Ropin Open Golf Tournament May 30 at the Eagle Crest Resort Course. It is a four-man scramble format and is open to the public. 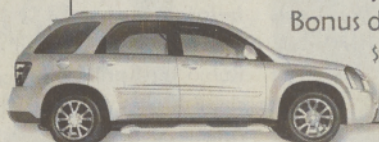
