The third grade classes also performed a Northwest Coastal Native American stick song along with stick and drum players.

Fourth grade students sang "Kapulu Kane," a Native Hawaiian song, along with ukulele and

puli stick players.

The fourth grade classes also played "B-A-G Rock" and the "Navajo Rain Dance" on the recorder. They finished by singing "I Walk in Beauty" and "Friends With a Song."

Fifth grade students sang "Come and Go With Me to That Land" along with keyboard and recorder players; they also sang "Three Little Birds," a song from Jamaica.

Fifth graders also played three recorder songs: "Recorder Fever," "Jazzin'," and "Moccasin Dance."

The fifth grade students closed the show by singing, "America, America."

The spring program is an annual event at Warm Springs Elementary, which will have the last day of school for the 2007-08 academic year this month.
