Notice to the Warm Springs community

As of Friday, May 30, 2008, **Raymond Gene Smith** is hereby permanently revoked from representing anyone before the Warm Springs Tribal Court.

If you have a pending agreement with Mr. Smith to act as a spokesperson for you, the Court sug-

gests:

- (1) you contact Mr. Smith immediately to arrange for him to refund you any money or other type of payment you have made to him, and,
- (2) arrange for a licensed spokesperson or attorney to take over your case.

In the Tribal Court of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs

To the parties named in the following cases: Both parties to the action may be represented by counsel, or may elect to represent themselves. If you cannot be present, you may have your approved legal council appear on your behalf at your own expense. Representation must be approved by presiding judge to ensure the rules governing admissibility to practice are met; therefore, a spokesperson form must be submitted at least five days prior to the hearing. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately. Failure to obtain Legal Council prior to the hearing is not sufficient cause to reschedule the hearing.

Elder protection order
In the matter of Reginald Winishut, tribal elder, case no. DO51-08: Based upon complaints/petitions filed with this court, this court hereby orders LaDawn Yallup to restrain himself/herself from any type of disruptive/stressful behavior at the elder's home: Residence located at High Looke Lodge, if under the influence of intoxicants, consuming or possessing alcoholic beverages/illegal drugs inside/outside the elder's home. Bringing intoxicated, disruptive or disrespectful friends to the elder's home. Causing, creating or allowing a situation that can result in the elder's stress by disruptive, disorderly or disrespectful behavior (including domestic violence) at the elder's home, Reginald Winishut, a respective elder of our community. This order shall remain in effect for an additional 45 days or until 11 a.m. on July 18, 2008. Failure to abide by this order will result with you being arrested and brought before the court to answer to a contempt of court and/or elder abuse charges, for which the court may sentence you to serve up to 90 days in jail and up to a \$500 fine. If the petitioner would like to have the elder protection order to continue past the above date, petitioner must submit a written request to the court for the elder protection order to continue.
