In the Tribal Court of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs

In the matter of Aldo Garcia, petitioner, and William Naypayer, respondent, Case No. R040-08.

On the 9th day of July, 2008, the Court issued an Ex Parte Temporary Restraining Order in the above captioned case enjoining the above named Respondent from contacting Petitioner in any manner and at certain places within the Warm Springs Reservation until a hearing could be held to determine whether Respondent should be further restrained from Petitioner. The restraining order against the Respondent is continued until the 21st day of July, 2009, as set out in the Ex Parte Temporary Restraining Order.

In the matter of Aldo Garcia, Petitioner, and Nathan Naypayer, Respondent, Case No. R040-08.

On the 9th day of July, 2008, the Court issued an Ex Parte Temporary Restraining Order in the above captioned case enjoining the above named Respondent from contacting Petitioner in any manner and at certain places within the Warm Springs Reservation until a hearing could be held to determine whether Respondent should be further restrained from Petitioner. The restraining order against the Respondent is continued until the 21st day of July, 2009, as set out in the Ex Parte Temporary Restraining Order.

In the matter of Children Protective Services, Petitioner, and Justin Boise, Respondent, Case No. JV30-06.

This is a notice that a petition for Jurisdictional Hearing has been scheduled with the Warm Springs Tribal Court. By this notice you are summoned to appear in this matter at a hearing scheduled for the 23rd day of September 2008 at 2 p.m. at the Warm Springs Tribal Court. All of the facts of the case will be heard at this hearing, including evidence you wish to present. You must appear to present your argument or the other side will automatically win. The Petitioner, Children Protective Services, may then be given all that is asked for in the petition. Both parties to this action may be represented by counsel, or may elect to represent themselves. If you cannot be present, you may have your approved legal council appear on your behalf at your own expense. Representation must be approved by presiding judge to ensure the rules governing admissibility to practice are met; therefore, a spokesperson form must be submitted at least five days prior to the hearing. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately.

Failure to obtain legal counsel prior to the hearing is not sufficient cause to rescheduled hearing.

Elder Protection Order
In the matter of Reginald Winishut, Case No. D051-08.

Based upon complaints, petitions filed with this Court, this Court hereby orders LaDawn Yallup to restrain himself/herself from any type of disruptive/stressful behavior, at the elders home: residence located at 2331 Ollalie Lane at High Lookie Lodge. If she is under the influence of intoxicants, consuming or possessing alcoholic beverages/illegal drugs inside/outside the elder's home. Bringing intoxicated, disruptive or disrespectful friends to the elder's home. Causing, creating, or allowing a situation that can result in the elder's stress by disruptive, disorderly, or disrespectful behavior (including domestic violence) at the elders home, Reginald Winishut, a respective elder of our community. This order shall remain in effect for an additional one year or until July 17, 2009. Failure to abide by this order will result with you being arrested and brought before the court to answer to a contempt of court and/or elder abuse charges, for which the court may sentence you to serve up to 90 days in jail and up to a \$500 fine, pursuant to Warm Springs Tribal Codes 200.610 Contempt of Court and/or 331.950 Enforcement of Elder Abuse Orders. To Respondent: May be possible exclusion from the Warm Springs Reservation. If the Petitioner would like to have the elder protection order to continue past the above date, Petitioner must submit a written request to the court for the elder protection order to continue.

Elder protection order
In the matter of Arlene Smith, tribal elder, case no. R090-08: Based upon complaints/petitions filed with this court, this court hereby orders Vernon Smith Sr. to restrain himself from any type of disruptive/stressful behavior at the elders home: residence located at 2503 Looksh St., if he is under the influence of intoxicants, consuming or possessing alcoholic beverages/illegal drugs inside/outside the elders home. Bringing intoxicated, disruptive or disrespectful friends to the elders home. Causing, creating or allowing a situation that can result in the elder's stress by disruptive, disorderly or disrespectful behavior (including domestic violence) at the elder's home, Arlene Smith, a respective elder of our community. This order shall remain in effect for an additional 30 days or until 29th day of August, 2008 at 11 a.m. Failure to abide by this order will result with you being arrested and brought before the court to answer to a contempt of court and/or elder abuse charge for which the court may sentence you to serve up to 90 days in jail and up to a \$500 fine.

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Exclusion orders
Warm Springs Confederated Tribes, plaintiff, vs. Simon Jaimes-Pineda, defendant, case no. CV212-07: It is hereby ordered and adjudged that the defendant is excluded permanently from the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. Compliance with this exclusion order may be enforced by the contempt power of the tribal court in accordance with chapter 200 of the Warm Springs tribal code. If the defendant is found on the reservation in violation of this exclusion order the court may impose jail, fine or both for contempt of court, in addition to violations of Warm Springs tribal code chapter 300, the tribal exclusion code.

Warm Springs Confederated Tribes, plaintiff, vs. Randy Tobin, defendant, case no. CV132-08: It is hereby ordered and adjudged that the defendant is excluded permanently from the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. Compliance with this exclusion order may be enforced by the contempt power of the tribal court in accordance with chapter 200 of the Warm Springs tribal code. If the defendant is found on the reservation in violation of this exclusion order the court may impose jail, fine or both for contempt of court, in addition to violations of Warm Springs tribal code chapter 300, the tribal exclusion code.

Warm Springs Confederated Tribes, plaintiff, vs. Nancy Tobin, defendant, case no. CV113-08: It is hereby ordered and adjudged that the defendant is excluded permanently from the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. Compliance with this exclusion order may be enforced by the contempt power of the tribal court in accordance with chapter 200 of the Warm Springs tribal code. If the defendant is found on the reservation in violation of this exclusion order the court may impose jail, fine or both for contempt of court, in addition to violations of Warm Springs tribal code chapter 300, the tribal exclusion code.

Warm Springs Confederated Tribes, plaintiff, vs. Quantae Cole, defendant, case no. CV94-08: It is hereby ordered and adjudged that the defendant is excluded permanently from the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. Compliance with this exclusion order may be enforced by the contempt power of the tribal court in accordance with chapter 200 of the Warm Springs tribal code. If the defendant is found on the reservation in violation of this exclusion order the court may impose jail, fine or both for contempt of court, in addition to violations of Warm Springs tribal code chapter 300, the tribal exclusion code.

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
