All objects must be accompanied by an object history form available at the Museum. Objects can also be submitted for appraisal only. Donations are always welcome. Museum policy is one object per family, per household.

The Museum is dedicated to the people of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation, whose vision, generosity and wisdom have created a legacy for our grandchildren's, grandchildren. Please help us preserve this legacy by providing detailed information about the pieces you submit for consideration.

The Basics:

- Acceptance of Objects dates are Friday, August 15 through Friday, September 5, 2008, 5 pm
- One object per person or family will be accepted. Object is to be at least 50 years old.
- Objects will not be accepted after the deadline, no exception.
- Object History form must be completed before object is appraised.

All acquisitions and final prices must be first approved by action of The Museum's Board of Directors.
